Salem, Or., Aug. 22.—C. M. Chappel, former salesman for the Silver King Mining company, has been cited to appear in justice court here September 12 to answer a charge of embezzlement filed by J. J. Langback, president of the mining company. Chappel, who had been making his headquarters in Salem for some time, disappeared last October. Sales of stock, said to have been made by Chappel to local investors but which no delivery was made, have been made good by officials of the company, it is understood.

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Waterouzel Holds Sunday Crowd by Dipping for Food
A water-ouzel, diving, swimming and fluttering its wings under water, while it cavorted about the bottom in search of food, attracted the attention of many visitors at Multnomah Falls Sunday noon. It would dart in a shallow pool of water and lose itself among the pebbles and rippling current, its lithe, slate-colored body blending perfectly with its surroundings and shielding it from detection by its enemies. Only those who had glimpsed its graceful movements before it dipped could follow its swift motion on the bottom of the stream. The water-ouzel, or dipper, frequents the Rocky Mountain and Coast ranges. It is about the size of a bob-white. It builds its nest of moss, usually in the spray of some waterfall.

Mining Congress Secretary Urges a High Metal Tariff
Urging a high tariff on metals, James F. Calbreath of Washington, D. C., secretary-manager of an American mining congress, informed the members of the Chamber of Commerce at luncheon Monday that the present price of metals is not an effect of tariff but of profiteering. Calbreath urged that the mining industry be protected on an equitable basis with other industries in the tariff legislation. The speaker has been secretary-manager of the congress since 1914, when he was elected at a meeting held in Portland.

Albany, Or., Aug. 22.—John W. Gaines, a pioneer of 1852, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. J. L. Davenport of Larwood, Sunday, following an illness of several months from paralysis. Mr. Gaines came west by ox team with his parents in 1852, settling in the neighborhood of the north fork of the Santiam river. His children survive. The funeral was held at Evidences this afternoon.

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Oregon Battalion of National Unemployed Legion Being Formed

Organization of an Oregon battalion of the National Unemployed Legion is in prospect for the near future, according to reports current in the city. The National legion is a non-sectarian, non-political organization with the avowed purpose of supplying temperate leadership to the unemployed in this country. The slogan of the organization is "justice and not charity." The Oregon unit of the legion, it is said, will eventually include four battalions of five companies each, with an enrollment of 50 persons in each company. Officers will be elected by ballot; no dues will be charged and no salaries will be paid. All work of the organization will be performed by volunteers.

Fall From Windmill Is Fatal to Pioneer

Eugene, Or., Aug. 23.—J. F. Smith, one of the last remaining of the pioneers of the early '50s and the last of a large family that crossed the plains in the early days, died Monday at the Eugene hospital, where he was taken Sunday night following an 18 foot fall from the windmill tower on his place east of Springfield. Smith's right arm was broken and his skull fractured, which resulted in concussion of the brain. He is survived by his wife and a son.
