PIONEER HIGHWAY PAVING IS FINISHED

Ridgefield, Wash., Aug. 25.—According to word from the office of County Engineer Schwarz, the Pacific highway, between Pioneer, four miles east of Ridgefield, and La Center, will be opened to traffic on September 10.

The contract for the paving of this stretch, totalling \$196,471.75, included about four and one half miles and was done in record time by the T. M. Morgan Paving company of Everett.

The Pacific highway is now hard surfaced for a distance of about 19 miles from La Center to Vancouver. The Ridgefield road, where it joins the highway at Crabbs corner in Pioneer, is also paved for more than four miles, making a paved road from Ridgefield to Vancouver, a distance of about 18 miles.

La Center will celebrate the opening of the Pacific highway with an appropriate ceremony. Mayor Thomas Headley appointed the following to have charge: Sylvester Fanning, Curtis Anderson, I. H. Shaver and W. H. McCann.

Washington, Aug. 24.—The I. C. C. today authorized the Great Northern Railway Co. to issue \$600,000 equipment road notes bearing interest at the rate of 6 1/2 per cent. The issue, which will be sold at not less than 97 1/2 per cent of par and accrued interest, will mature August 1, 1921.
