

CHAMBERLAIN IS MADE TARGET IN PAGE'S LETTERS

Washington, Sept. 1.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL)—George E. Chamberlain, ex-senator from Oregon, receives mention several times in the monthly installment of "The London Letters of Walter H. Page" in the September issue of World's Work, Page, who died a short time since, was ambassador to Great Britain during the war, and the close adviser of President Wilson during the controversy over Panama canal talks.

Former Senator Chamberlain was a leader in the senate in favor of exempting American coastwise shipping from payment of tolls. For this reason he comes in for a measure of scorn in the letters of Ambassador Page and also at the hands of Burton J. Hendrick, who has compiled the correspondence and brought it together into a connected story.

CRITICISM RESENTFUL

In one letter to the president the American ambassador referred to a conversation with Sir Edward Gray, then foreign minister, in which they commiserated with each other over the criticism they had encountered. Page continued:

"After telling me that I need fear no trouble at this end of the line, he told me how severely he is now criticized by a 'certain element' for 'bowing too low to the Americans.' We then each bowed low to the other. The yellow press and Chamberlain would give a year's growth for a photograph of us in that posture."

This letter was in March, 1914, after the debate in the senate had opened, following the disclosure that President Wilson, who had spoken for "free tolls" in the preceding campaign, had changed his position and was for repeal of the law.

PAGE LETTERS SEVERE

The Page letters are severe in their criticism of those who opposed his ideas and still favored the exemption of American ships. He had precisely the same view as the British; that any other position was dishonest and dishonorable.

"We made a bargain," he said in a letter to the president from Scotland, where he was visiting at Scotch country homes, "a solemn compact, and we have broken it. Whether it was a good bargain or a bad one, a silly one or a wise one, that's far from the point, isn't it? This tolls matter stands in the way of everything. They have no respect for Mr. Taft, for they remember that he might have vetoed the bill and they ask, whenever they dare, what you will do about it. They hold our government in shame so long as this thing stands."

CATERS TO BRITISH

This strain of British hostility, of inability on the other side to understand how America could do such a thing as place a different interpretation on the Hay-Pauncefote treaty than the one they desired, runs through the Page letters to the president. There was a constant lament that America might do so much, could lead the British "to do anything" if only the "wretched" tolls question were reversed. This anxiety to cement relations with Britain, or to cast off the gathering British hostility, appears from the letters of Page and Wilson to be the thing that was in the president's mind when he made his famous "mystery" appeal to congress in the message on Panama tolls:

"I ask this of you in support of the foreign policy of the administration. I shall not know how to deal with other matters of even greater delicacy and it is to me in ungrudging measure."

WILSON'S TONE CORDIAL

The letters of Wilson to Page are cordial in tone and written with a manifest effort to smooth the way for the ambassador in his chagrin over "breaks" he had made in after dinner speeches. What Page regarded as little pleasantries and courtesy to his hosts, he complained, were twisted by American critics into truckling.

These Anglophobes—Irish and Pan-American," he wrote, wearily, hound me wherever I go."

The contribution from the Page letters comes with particular interest at this time, when the senate has before it the Borah bill to make American ships again free from payment of toll.

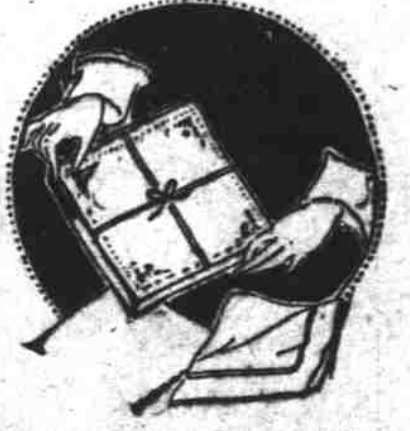
