# BASEBALL, NOT TRIAL, HOLDS DR. BRUMFIELD

Woman's Testimony That She Saw  
Him Drive Wildly By With Hu-  
man Feet Dangling From Car  
Does Not Distract From Games

Roseburg, Oct. 13.—Dr. Richard M. Brumfield, on trial for the murder of Dennis Russell, whose headless body was found under the dentist's burned automobile July 14, sat in court this morning apparently more absorbed in the world series than in the most damaging evidence heard in the case thus far.

He talked with his family and with officers and court attaches about baseball and sat as though detached while Grant Clayton told about a bullet, a scrap of hair identified as Russell's, a piece of skull bone and a fragment of a cartridge shell which he found in a pool of blood on the Pacific highway nine tenths of a mile south of the murdered man's cabin.

He disclaimed to be concerned when M. M. Meredith said that the rifle which was found at the wrecked automobile was one he had seen in the possession of the dentist.

INTRODUCED JUNE 26  
Meredith said that Brumfield and Russell first became acquainted June 26, when he introduced them at his ranch. They met there, he said, when Brumfield made a casual call. Russell there inquired about some land boundaries. The three arranged a hunting trip, which was postponed because Russell was unable to go. Meredith is a relative of Russell by marriage.

F. R. Mene of the University of Oregon medical school said that the blood found on the highway by Clayton, when tested, was found to be that of a human being.

PROBUDING FEET SEEN  
B. E. Hargis, who found Russell's hat near the blood on the highway, and M. H. Shelton, who found an empty cartridge shell at the same spot, also testified, identifying the articles.

# Material for Home Brew Under Ban

Washington, Oct. 13.—(U. N. S.)—An official order went out from Washington today to prohibition enforcement officials to stop the sale of the materials that go into the making of home brew.

State prohibition directors and agents throughout the country will be directed to make raids on business concerns that deal in articles for the manufacture of home brew, such as malt, hops, fruit sugars, bottling appliances and the appliances from which stills may be constructed. It was stated at prohibition headquarters.

# WIZARD COLLAPSES IN K. K. K. HEARING

Washington, Oct. 13.—Imperial Wizard William J. Simmons collapsed today before the house rules committee probing the Ku Klux Klan.

"I ask that God forgive you, for you know not what you do," Simmons said as he broke down under cross-questioning, in asserting that the Klan were ignorant as to what they were attacking.

THE HEARING  
The hearing was immediately recessed while Simmons recovered. He resumed the stand after 10 minutes, during which he had a violent coughing spell.

GREAT GOBLIN LOVE SENDS  
RESIGNATION TO HIS CHIEF  
Indianapolis, Ind., Oct. 13.—(U. P.)—Great Gobbie C. W. Love of the Great Lakes domain of the Ku Klux Klan resigned today.

Love, who was head of the strong-hold of the "Invisible Empire of the North," comprising Indiana, Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky and Virginia, sent his resignation to Imperial Wizard William Simmons, who is in Washington.

R. B. Love, brother of the goblin, also resigned his post as King Kleagle of Indiana. Both brothers said they were leaving the city to engage in business and that their resignations did not necessarily mean they were out of the order.

# LLOYD GEORGE IS GOING TO ARMS PARLEY

Only Unexpected Developments  
In Irish Situation Will Hold  
British Premier at Home; May  
Remain Six Weeks, Report.

London, Oct. 13.—(U. P.)—Premier Lloyd George will attend the Washington limitation of arms conference, remaining in the United States six weeks, unless unexpected developments in the Irish situation prevent, it was authoritatively stated today.

GREAT BRITAIN, ITALY AND  
FRANCE NAME DELEGATES

From Great Britain, France and Italy today came either official or authoritative announcements regarding their delegations to the limitation of armaments conference in Washington next month.

Evidence of increased European interest in the conference and of the importance attached to its discussions was seen in the decision of Lloyd George to personally attend, contrary to expectations, and in the official French announcement that Premier Briand would head France's delegation. Italy named three of its most prominent statesmen and announced plans for the sending of army, navy and aerial advisers.

Delegates officially appointed and others expected to attend are:  
Great Britain (probable): David Lloyd George, premier (probable); Arthur James Balfour, appointed; Lord Lee, appointed; George Pearce, Australia, appointed; Sir John Salmond, New Zealand; Sir Robert Borden, Canada. One of the latter will probably be appointed. British delegation will have six members.

France (official)—Premier Aristide Briand; Rene Viviani, former premier; Admiral Sarraut, Ambassador of France in London.

Italy (probable)—Dr. Schanzer, Roland Ricci, ambassador to Washington; Albertini, minister of foreign affairs; and others may be appointed.

Japan has appointed her delegates as follows: Ambassador Shidehara, Baron Adami, Prince Tagawa, and others may be appointed.

# Ford Claims He Can Put Idle to Work

Cincinnati, Ohio, Oct. 13.—(U. P.)—"If the government will let me have Muscle Shoals, I'll teach 'em something about solving unemployment problems."

Henry Ford, automobile manufacturer and owner of the Detroit, Toledo & Ironville railroad, made that statement in an exclusive interview here prior to his departure for West Virginia coal fields Wednesday night.

There are jobs in this country for every man who wants to work," he said.

POSSIBILITIES CLAIMED  
"We have shown this country something about employing men, but that is only a start to what we can do if we get Muscle Shoals, isn't it, gentlemen?"

He turned to his son, Edsel, and three executives, C. E. Sorensen, W. H. Smith and W. C. Cowling, who are accompanying him on his trip.

THE MUSCLE SHOALS plant was established by the government during the war for manufacture of nitrates. Ford was offered to take over the establishment to manufacture fertilizer, but his offer has not been accepted.

Although his party is not concerning itself with negotiations for purchase of the plant, Ford said he would like to see his secretary to consult with officials of the Cincinnati, Milford & Lancaster Traction line here today.

"If the figure is right, I have told my secretary to notify officials of the road that I would be interested," he said. The road would be converted into a branch road of the Detroit, Toledo & Ironville road.

# PLUMBERS IN LEAGUE, SAYS LOCAL CRITIC

School Board Amazed at Exposure  
of Alleged Gentlemen's  
Agreement; Director's Son  
Partner in Brickyard Plant.

Portland school directors listened with amazement Thursday night when Al Dauch, a plumbing contractor, charged that the plumbers of the city "have a gentlemen's understanding whereby the lowest bidder is to figure 10 per cent profit and 10 per cent overhead on the job."

He declared it was usually a foregone conclusion among the bidders who was to get the job and the other contenders made their bids accordingly.

Another surprise came when it was discovered that a son of School Director Martin owns a part interest in a Forest Grove brickyard which provides brick of a quality which School Director Thomas declared should be used in the new James John high school.

Dauch, whose bid was lowest for the plumbing at James John, said he had broken away from the combine because he wanted to "keep his fingers clean."

Dauch said that a combine among plumbers had existed through the Master Plumbers' association, to which he had formerly belonged. But at the time of the trouble over the plumbing of Maryville school, he had become disgusted and had told the other members that he would play his own game after this.

"Was W. S. Fleming a member of this combine?" asked the board. Fleming's bid was only \$500 higher than Dauch's.

BID SUBMITTED SECRETLY  
"He was a member of the Master Plumbers' association," said Dauch. Dauch told of the secrecy with which the bid was submitted.
