

REPORT DISCLOSES STREETS BECOME MORE INADEQUATE

Portland's downtown street system is showing inadequacies in caring for traffic. A "firmer fixation" of a dominant central retail business district is desirable. The separation between the east and west sides should be lessened by bridges to the north and south of those now in use. There should be river bank development, but any plan that does not utilize the esthetic features of the river will be deficient.

These are among the outstanding features of a "City Plan of the West Side of Portland," just issued as a preliminary study by the city planning bureau of the City Club of Portland. The report submitted by a committee consisting of E. T. Mische, Fred F. Henshaw, Joseph Jacobberger, Henry M. Parks and Theodore W. Veness has not been officially adopted by the club, but is issued for information and consideration.

REPORT IS ILLUSTRATED
The report is illustrated with drawings, maps and pictures. The widening of Morrison street is proposed from the river to its union with Washington, thence to Twenty-third street. A river esplanade is suggested that will extend back to First street, between the Steel bridge and Riverview cemetery. In its conclusions the report also states: Betterments in city plan, and especial-

by traffic arrangements, are procurable by a street revision plan having business advantages as a prompting motive. Impediments to travel are increasing with time, in degree and in number of points at which they occur.

CORRECTION IS ESSENTIAL
Inconveniences and intensification of congestion, also enlargement of area affected, are certain to increase if corrective methods are not applied. Ultimately the delays in and necessary diversions of travel will inflict large loss upon the community.

Continuous increase in travel put upon the streets, an occurrence bound to take place as the population grows, without enlarging the capacity of the streets or instituting alternative means of relief, will aggravate traffic difficulties. Corrective means to be applied properly include not only relief satisfactory to the abutting property owners injured by congestion or otherwise, but a plan arrangement calculated to offer a permanent solution to the traffic difficulties of the future.

Bridges added to the immediate south and north of those now serving pedestrian and vehicular traffic will have profound influence on the currents of travel in the west side flat.

EXISTING ADVANTAGES
Taking full advantage of the spaciousness of specially suited existing streets is admonished and offers material compensations.

South Parkway extended is a logical intersecting member of a revised plan structure. A diagonal street, following the foot of the hills, is a part of a complete scheme, but, except for the lesser cost of immediate construction, is not urgent.

The bridge elevations of the Williams-ette river must be determined in connection with the treatment of the river embankment.

Any plan for river embankment development that does not adequately utilize

the esthetic features of the river will be deficient.

An adequate esthetic treatment of the river embankment is a practicable means whereby property values between it and the central business district will be enhanced and ample provision for a great artery for city traffic along the west side flat will be guaranteed.

State Accepts New Deaf School Unit

Salem, Oct. 12.—The new industrial building at the State School for Deaf, was formally accepted by the state board of control Wednesday after an inspection of the structure, which is of two stories, concrete construction and covers 46 by 88 feet. Dr. J. P. Graham Dies Following Auto Accident

Dr. J. P. Graham died Wednesday night in his home on Thurman street as the result of injuries received in an automobile accident near Oregon City, September 7. His skull was fractured and he suffered other injuries, causing pneumonia. Dr. Graham was a member of the Tenth Pennsylvania regiment in the Spanish-American war and during the World war was an officer with the Oregon hospital unit and regimental

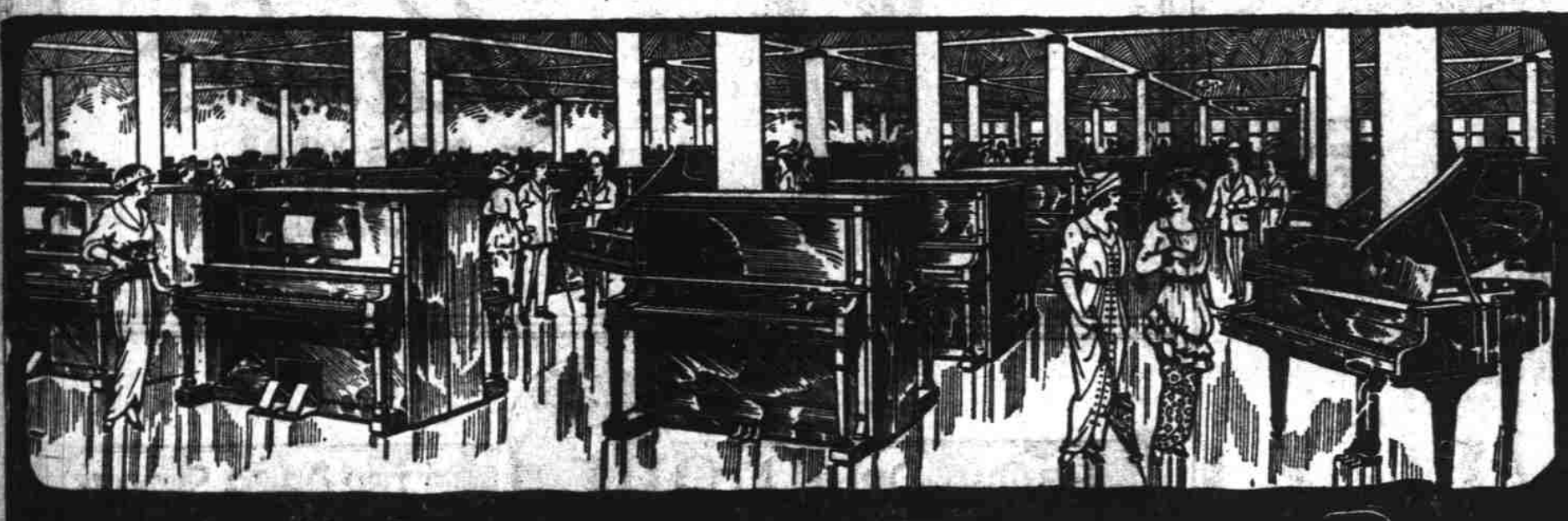
surgeon in an engineer unit with the rank of major. He was graduated from the University of Oregon Medical School in 1908. Dr. Graham is survived by a widow and his parents in Pennsylvania. The funeral will be held Friday at 1 p. m. at Finley's chapel under Elk auspices. The body will be sent to McMinnville for burial.

Oregon City, Oct. 12.—Whether or not the passing of Dr. J. P. Graham, will have any bearing on the sentence of J. L. Spinks, Portland automobile mechanic, guilty of driving while intoxicated and of having liquor in his possession, is conjectural. Morris Galbreath, jointly indicted, was freed by a jury. 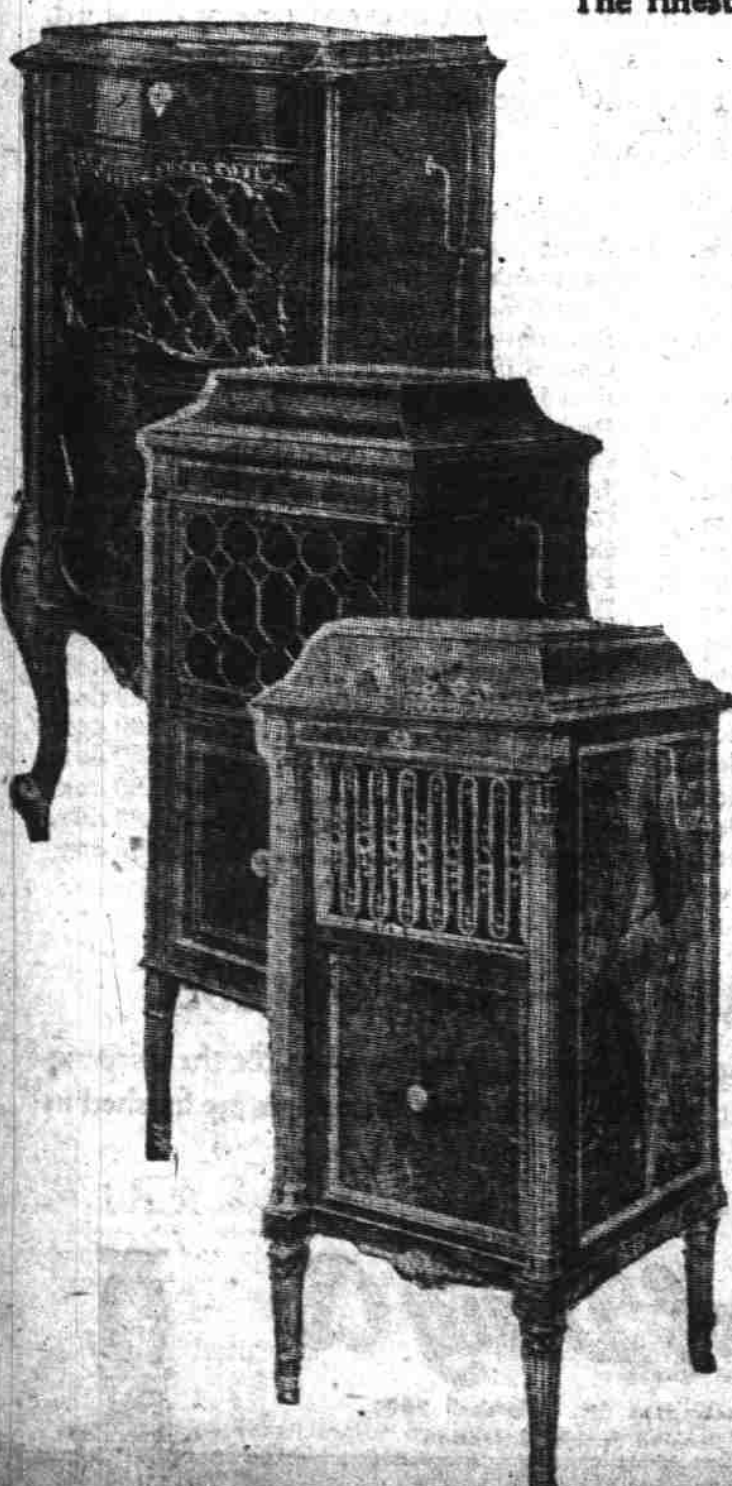

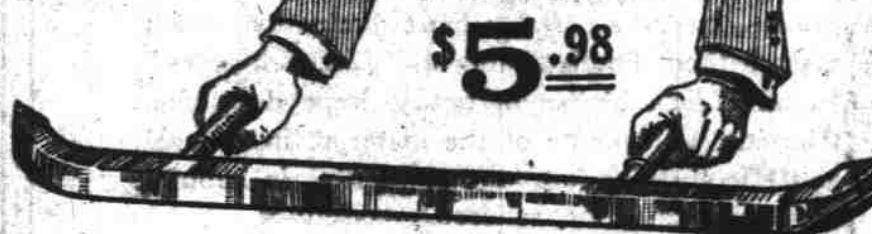

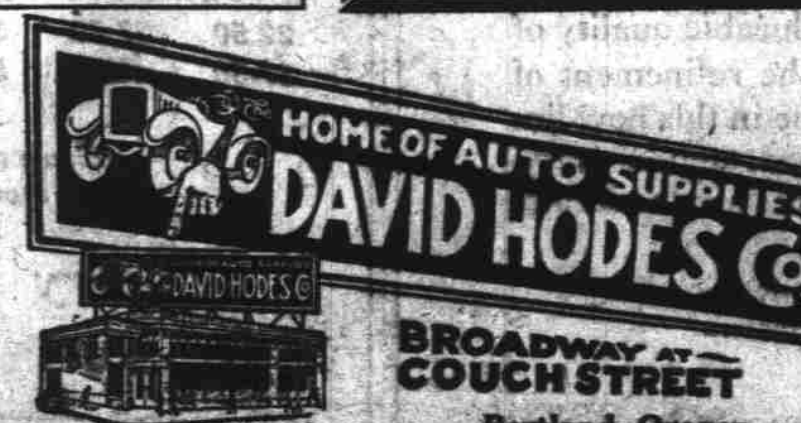
