

FRESH EGGS SHORT; MOST STORAGE SOLD

Many stores continue to sell storage eggs and give the public the impression that the stock is fresh. The law provides that dealers must place a suitable sign on all cold storage egg packages, but only in isolated instances is this law obeyed.

It is always a safe bet that the retailer who obeys the law and places a cold storage announcement on his egg case will treat you right in other lines. Consumers are advised to purchase eggs only when they are assured they are getting what they are paying for. As fully 90 per cent of the eggs now being sold in the retail shops have been in cold storage, it naturally develops that the average retailer is offering cold storage stock.

Butter is again back to the previous price and is not expected to advance for a while.

Cheese prices are slightly higher. Consumers should examine the side of the cheese to see whether they are getting the brand they asked for.

Poultry prices are just about the same as last week. Turkeys are being offered in a few of the larger shops—but the price is rather high at 65c to 60c a pound.

Fresh salmon remains in very heavy supply with retailers selling at 10c for the silver-side or young stock, while 20c is asked for the very red fish.

Halibut is again being generally offered with most retailers asking 25c a pound.

Oysters are of very good quality and the price is the same as a year ago. Oranges are higher, but apples are very low priced. It would not be a bad idea to purchase a family package. Retailers sell them at \$1.25 to \$1.75 per box of usual size.

J. M.
