

FISH IN SUPPLY; BREAD CHEAPER

Markets are today somewhat better supplied with small fish and especially the sea stock. While there continues a scarcity of halibut, plenty of salmon is offering and this is being sold at prices that are extremely low.

Fresh sea perch are available, also flounders and ocean smelt. Crabs are of excellent quality and in liberal supply. Razor clams are likewise being carried in stock by leading fish retailers. Priced at 30c to 40c down.

Butter is showing no price change, but the next movement is expected to be downward. A drop in the price of patent flour is likely soon, but in the meantime some of the retailers are shading their quotations. Better shop around and see.

While most of the bakers continue to ask 10c a pound for consumers for their bread, one Yamhill street baker is freely offering the wrapped stock at 8c, and claims to be making money at that. The same baker is offering double loaves of one-pound each, at 12c for the two pounds. There is economy in buying such stock.
