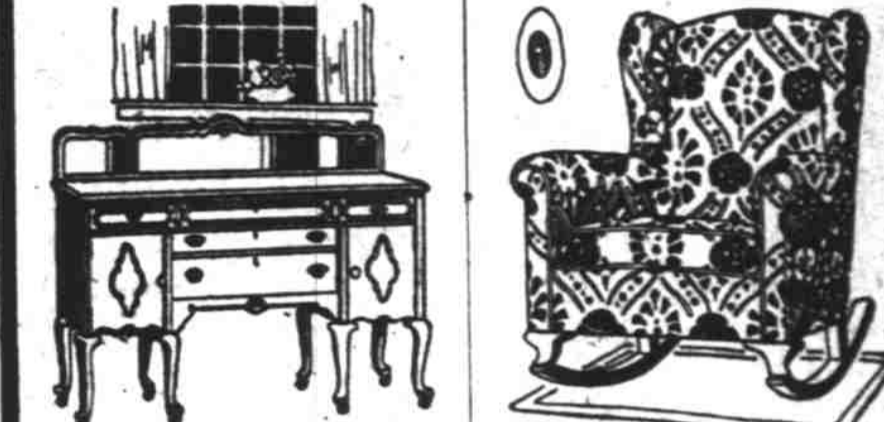

Land Exchange Proposed—A proposed land exchange with the Baker White Pine company has been approved by the United States forest service which would give all the timber on some 273 acres of national forest land near Astoria, Or., to the lumber company in exchange for 2700 acres of cut-over land belonging to the company. Papers will be sent to Washington for approval. The proposed exchange is the first under the land exchange law governing the Whitman national forest.
