

**Wilson's Attitude  
On Freedom of Seas  
Revived by Program**

(By United News)  
Washington, Nov. 14.—An unusual analogy is presented in the interpretation placed on an agreement as to armaments virtually abrogating the Anglo-Japanese alliance, and former President Wilson's abandonment of the issue of freedom of the seas after the adoption of the League of Nations covenant. When asked as to the freedom of the

seas in Paris, Wilson replied that he had just discovered he had no issue in this, for if the League of Nations lived, all countries would be bound together to prevent war. Consequently there would be no neutrals and no question of freedom of the seas.  
The much mooted Anglo-Japanese alliance is now interpreted as being out of date and useless, and consequently not an issue, if there is an agreement on armaments.

**California Criminal  
Syndicalism Law Is  
Held Constitutional**

San Francisco, Nov. 14.—(U. P.)—The constitutionality of the criminal syndicalism act passed by the state legislature of 1919 is upheld by a decision of the state supreme court, which reviewed the cases of two radicals. The supreme court upheld the decisions of the lower court in sentencing them to San Quentin.

John C. Taylor and James McHugh of Oakland, Cal., radicals who were convicted in 1919, are the men whose sen-

tences were sustained by the supreme court.

Miss Anita Whitney, prominent society woman, charity worker and communist, who also was sentenced, still has an appeal pending. As other points were involved in her appeal, her case was not ruled on in the present decision.
