The clothing Oregon contributed was not separated from the remainder, but here is the total given by the 4000 Baptist churches in the Northern Baptist convention Two thousand bales of clothing, weigh-

ing 500,000 pounds and valued at approximately \$1,000,000. These bales contained 50 barrels of toys and dolls, 10,000 blankets, 45,000 pairs of shoes, 50,000 cakes of soap, 65,000 men's gar-ments, 175,000 children's and infants' garments, 200,000 women's garments and a correspondingly large quantity of bonnets, mittens, stockings and other miscellaneous supplies

Every Baptist church in Portland helped to fill this ship, said the Rev. Mr. Austin. Much of the clothing was collected by Sunday school children and the young people's unions. Oregon sent about half a carload. All the Baptist women's societies in

the state are now sending hospital supplies to Dr. F. W. Goddard's hospital at Shaoh Sling Chin, South China, under the name of their organization, known as the "White Cross," which is similar to the great American Red Cross. 
