

TACOMA MAN IS POLITICAL GUIDE TO SEC. MELLON

Washington, Jan. 6.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL).—Elmer, Dover, once of Ohio, and once secretary to Senator Mark Hanna, now counted as a Tacoma, Wash., man, is to become the political guardian of Secretary of Mellon of the treasury department.

This is the prevailing opinion here in an interesting chain of gossip. It serves to explain the fact that Mr. Dover's selection as an assistant secretary of the treasury was not discussed in advance with Senator Wesley L. Jones or Senator Miles Poindexter, the Washington senators, who ordinarily would be expected to have something to say about it.

MASTER IN POLITICS
Mr. Dover is considered one of the old masters of political art. He learned the game with Hanna, and was at one time secretary of the Republican national committee. In the treasury he is to be in charge of the internal revenue bureau, which is the stronghold of the old-time plebeians, with over 4000 deputies unfettered by civil service.

It is suspected, however, that Mr. Dover's most important job will be as political adviser to "Uncle Andrew" Mellon, the secretary of the treasury. Mr. Mellon is said to be the second richest man in the United States and in financial matters as wise as any owl that ever sat upon a limb. But members of congress have complained that when it came to making remarks about the soldier bonus and about sales tax and surtax, "Uncle Andrew" was sadly in need of a coach.

ON INNER CIRCLE
That is where Mr. Dover should shine. He is reputed to be in great favor at the White House. In fact, it was he who first disclosed to the public, as a result of his dining at the White House, that the president feeds Laddie Boy, the presidential dog, with bits of meat from the presidential table, from the tips of the presidential fingers.

New Plot Hatched In Mexico, Aimed to Overthrow Obregon

San Antonio, Texas, Jan. 6.—(I. N. S.).—A new revolt to overthrow Alvaro Obregon as president of Mexico has been started by Antonio Villareal, former minister of agriculture in the Obregon cabinet, according to official information received here today. Villareal, now in the mountains near Monterey, Mexico, has enlisted the aid of General Pablo Gonzalez at Laredo and the Carranzista followers here, according to the report, and claims to have 10,000 men ready for the field. The Obregon troops during the past three days reported to have made over 250 arrests in connection with the new revolutionary plot. United States agents are expected to Villareal to cross the international boundary to further his revolutionary activities.

Flour Tariff Urged To Protect Interest Of Wheat Farmers

Washington, Jan. 5.—(U. P.).—A tariff duty of at least 65 cents per 100 pounds on flour should be levied by congress to protect American wheat flour producers and millers, Senator Ladd, North Dakota, representing the agricultural bloc, told the senate finance committee today. This represents an increase of 15 cents a hundred pounds over the rate proposed in the pending tariff bill.

Would Raise Duty On North Pacific Fish in New List

Washington, Jan. 6.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL).—Senator Jones of Washington appeared before the senate finance committee Thursday and asked for a duty of 3 cents a pound on salmon and halibut from North Pacific waters, which is 1 cent more than the general duty proposed on fish by the tariff bill.

Conduct Funeral of Mrs. Palmer Today

Washington, Jan. 6.—The funeral of Mrs. A. Mitchell Palmer, wife of former Attorney General Palmer, will be held here this afternoon. Mrs. Palmer died Wednesday night of heart disease, her illness having extended from early in October. Mrs. Palmer was an active worker in the Society of Friends, which will conduct the funeral services. Burial will be in the family plot at Easton, Md.

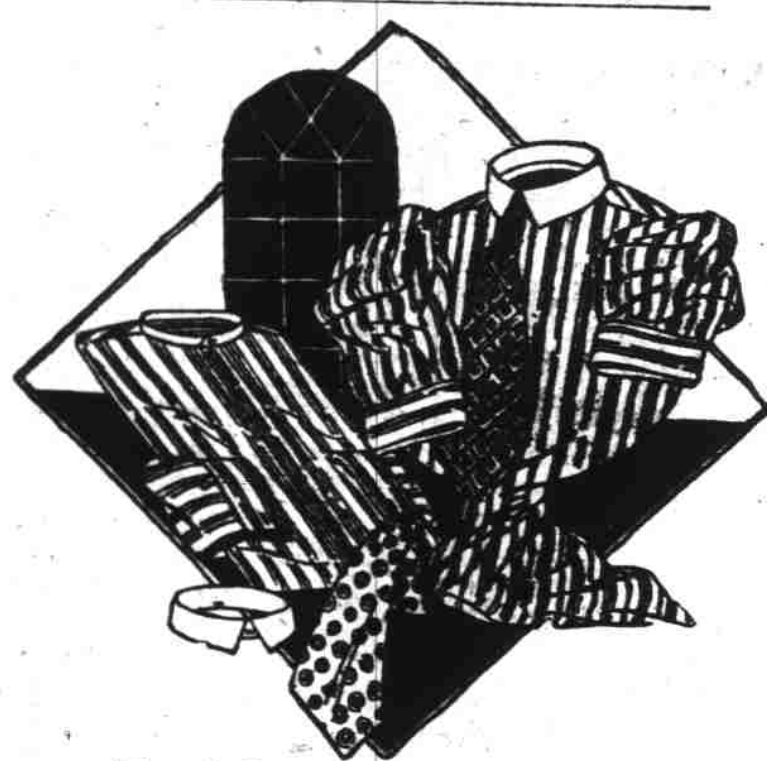
