

ASTORIA-HAWAIIAN ISLAND SERVICE TO BE INSTITUTED

Matson Line to Reenter Field by Taking Over Cordova's Business With 9000-Ton Steamer.

Astoria, Jan. 1.—Astoria will have regular and rapid steamship communication with the Hawaiian islands after February 5. The Matson Navigation company of San Francisco will make Astoria one of the three ports in its Pacific coast-Hawaiian islands service, it announced today in a telegram to the port of Astoria commission.

THE FIRST VESSEL of the service, the Lurline, will call at Astoria, February 5, going thence to Seattle before heading for Honolulu. The service will be maintained at from 30 to 35 day intervals.

THE MATSON LINE RECALLED This will be the second time the Matson company has operated out of the Columbia river for Hawaii. The former service was abandoned last summer when the shipping strike interfered.

THE CORDOVA SERVICE of the Alaska Steamship company supplanted the Matson run.

With the withdrawal of the Cordova a few weeks ago, negotiations were opened with the Matson people by R. D. Plummer, general traffic manager of the port of Astoria, Captain C. W. Saunders, operating manager of the Matson company, visited Astoria recently investigating the advisability of instituting a service to take over the business built up by the Cordova. It was upon his recommendation that the new service has been authorized.

MAS PASSENGER FACILITIES The Cordova developed a large outboard bound business in freight and carried a considerable number of passengers.

The Lurline, which is a 9000 ton vessel, built in 1918, can accommodate 50 first class passengers. Finest was substituted today over the facilities which will now be available to shippers of the Columbia river territory to engage in the island trade.

HOQUIAM TURBOBOATS TAKE TO BURNING OF FUEL OIL Hoquiam, Wash., Jan. 1.—Shortage high price of wood fuel, despite the fact that the district has 22 sawmills producing wood for burning purposes, has led nearly all Hoquiam and Aberdeen tugboat owners to install oil burning equipment in their tugs.

Tugs in which the equipment has already been installed include: Ranger and Harbor Queen of the Allman-Hubbis Tugboat company; Manette of the Gray Harbor Construction company; Hoquiam of the Shafer Brothers Logging company; Montezano, and Forester of the Forester Tugboat company, Aberdeen.

All have had sea service, all are Americans and many have sailed out of this port on previous voyages. 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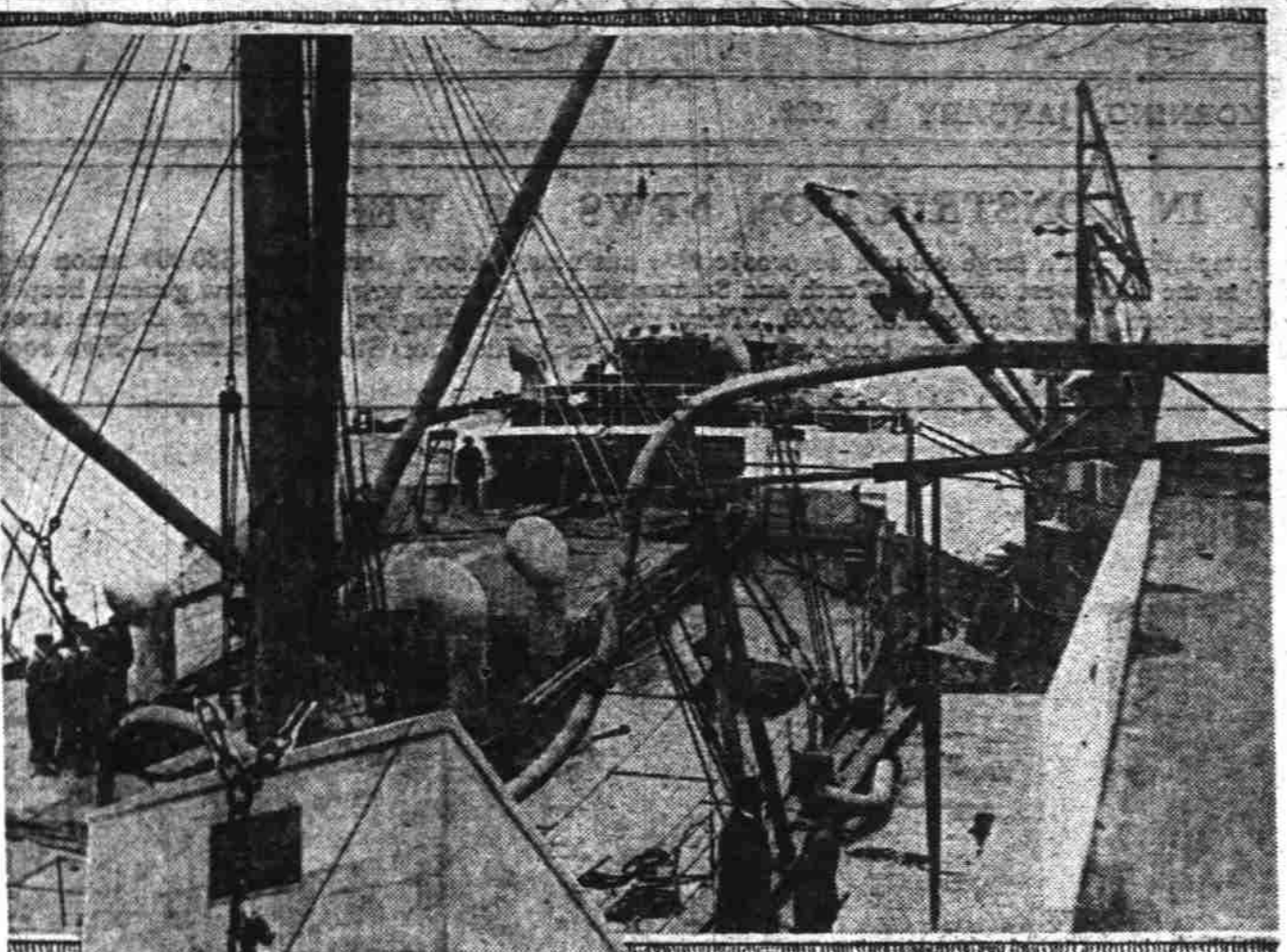
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PNEUMATIC TUBE WORKING COPRA CARGO

First of the big copra carriers to arrive in Portland for the Portland Vegetable Oil company was the steamship Montague which will complete the discharge of 2000 tons tomorrow night at the plant. The pneumatic gear for the hoisting of bulk copra was tried for the first time and proved a success. Barring faulty starting and choking, due to turning over of new equipment, the plant pumped out at the rate of 30 tons

an hour. To overcome loss of time on lay days and complete the discharge of the cargo by Monday, the Montague worked two gangs yesterday with overhead gear.

She will be ready to turn back to the shipping board on Tuesday and in turn will be transferred to the Columbia Pacific Shipping company. A full cargo awaits her for the outward trip from the Columbia.
