SECRET PRICE BUTTER PRICE

Consumers who want really worth while quality halibut should make it known to their retailers that they desire the fish caught off the Oregon coast. Fish that comes from far northern waters may be good, and may not be. It comes through Seattle houses, while the stock that comes from off the Oregon coast is brought direct to Portland wholesalers. It is probably much the freshest.

There is no reason why Portland consumers should purchase halibut from Seattle but when even better quality is available in the home territory. The buying of the Oregon coast product will build up a big local industry and will mean much to every resident of this section.

Another thing consumers here should remember. If it were not for the local fishery, the halibut that is available but off the Oregon coast, they would pay more for this fish, because Seattle is never averse to making Portland pay for anything it purchases there.

From the quality standpoint alone it is, therefore, best to demand the Oregon coast halibut offerings.

Occasional supplies of fresh salmon are appearing from the Columbia and from Oregon coast streams, but supplies are still scant.

Columbia river smelt have again made their appearance on the local market. Retail prices in private stores: Eggs—Salmon, 43¢ to 45¢; pullets, 40¢ to 43¢; Salmon—20¢ to 30¢; halibut, 25¢; perch, 10¢; sturgeon, 10¢; local salmon, \$1.90 to 2.00 per case, 49 lbs.

POTATO MARKETS

FORCED HIGHER

STRONGER DEMAND

Very liberal increase in the movement of Oregon potatoes is shown, and at better prices. On every side there is a growing call for potato supplies and this is forcing upward bids for the better quality offerings.

Purchases of potatoes of local quality are reported in carload lots at Clackamas county points around \$1.50 per cental, 70 lb. bags, while reports from the Willamette valley indicate that for limited lots of selected stock in Eastern Oregon, prices are being offered at \$1.25 to \$1.50 per cental, 70 lb. bags.

Trading in Garima is somewhat increased. Some Garima purchases are shown as low as \$1 per cental, 70 lb. bags, but general transactions are around \$1.25 for good stuff. Retail sales slightly below this price are reported.

Respective of what the Chicago market is doing there is a very firm tone here for good milling wheat. Bluestem and heart as well as turkey red of the best grade, are so scarce that holders appear to be able to secure almost any price they ask within reason. Millers are bidding around \$1.18 for the better class of business stock. Best offered for sale is locally produced 20 available below \$1.20. Millers are bidding \$1.08 for club wheat, but some dealers are offering it at \$1.10 to \$1.15 per bushel, although this latter is an extreme price.

Quota volume of European business is confirmed in the wheat market, but the bulk of it appears to be in parcel lots. Cargo sales at the moment are very slow.

Millers are inclined to show a stronger tone but prices in the feed division were unchanged for the day.

Hay market is badly overplentiful with the exception of the Oregon country, but even this is not really scarce.

A correction will be found in the price of Oregon hay. Oregon country hay, which has been a topographical error, is being sold at a price of \$8.10 to \$8.15 per ton. Bluestem and heart, \$1.18 to \$1.20; Red Wagon, \$1.08 to \$1.10; turkey red, \$1.14 to \$1.16.
