

WALLACE BACKS PLEA FOR CUTS IN RAIL FREIGHT

Washington, Jan. 26.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL)—Secretary of Agriculture Wallace, in his Traffic club address at Philadelphia a few days ago, added his voice to the demand that freight rates come down, taking their share in the drop with the price of farm products.

"Forty per cent of our people are directly dependent upon what they grow from the soil," said Mr. Wallace, "and the purchasing power of that 40 per cent cannot be maintained so seriously out of relation to the purchasing power of the other 60 per cent. If we do not recognize the national danger in this condition and take prompt measures to cure it, the cure will come through the operation of brutal economic forces which will lay upon the 60 per cent who do not live on the farms a burden heavy as that the farmers are now bearing."

Mr. Wallace pointed out that after the railroads were confronted with largely increased operating costs they sought relief from federal authority, and were given an increase in rates. For a time the farmer did not suffer, for his products commanded high prices, also. Then prices for the farmer's main crops went down below cost of production and below pre-war normal. In Iowa, his home state, corn is worth only 65 per cent of pre-war price.

In railroad rates, however, the Iowa farmer pays 150 per cent more than he did before the war, and 160 per cent of former rent and taxes. Agriculture cannot expect complete recovery, said the secretary, until a normal ratio is restored between farm prices and freight rates.

Gen. Taylor, Who Died in California, Had Unique Record

Delivers into war stories, find, if you can, a record which in steady brilliancy outlines that of Asher C. Taylor, who, according to word received by friends in Portland, died a few days ago in Letterman hospital, California.

General Taylor filled more than a private and was retired a brigadier general. He served in the Civil war, in Cuba and in the Philippines. He was on the army payroll for 50 years. He died when he was 81.

He began as a private in the third Wisconsin regiment during the Civil war.

After serving in the three wars he was for a time before he was retired on duty in Alaska. His promotions were successive of service in every rank.

Goethals to Reach Spokane February 2

Spokane, Wash., Jan. 26.—When General George W. Goethals, builder of the Panama canal, arrives in Spokane, February 2, to begin a personal survey of the Columbia basin project, he will be accompanied by a staff of more than 100 men. General Goethals will investigate the data already gathered by state engineers and the original Columbia basin survey commission. Field work will be done personally by General Goethals, who will make Spokane his headquarters.

Tourist Fined \$20 On Mashing Charge

Wheelright, a tourist, found other attractions besides the scenery in the observation tower on Coconino street, according to the testimony in municipal court Wednesday of Manager Finley, who said that the stranger insisted on forcing his attentions on a young woman attendant in the tower. Although he pleaded not guilty, Judge Rossman fined Wheelright \$20 for disorderly conduct.

Bootlegging is no game for a novice, as Dave Wheeler found out in municipal court Wednesday afternoon. According to his testimony in court Wheeler, who pleaded to violating the prohibition ordinance, was apprehended in his first offense as a liquor dealer. Judge Rossman administered a \$250 fine to discourage him in his pursuit.

FEW CASES OF CONTAGIOUS BAKER, Jan. 26.—Dr. J. W. Huff, city health officer, reports few cases of contagious disease this winter. He lays the absence of smallpox to the fact that approximately 1000 people were vaccinated last winter at the suggestion of the doctors. Only a few cases of scarlet fever have been reported in the past few months.
