

### PHONE COMPANY PLANS \$100,000 IMPROVEMENTS

Construction work costing more than \$100,000 and planned to provide facilities for improvements and extensions of telephone service on the west side, has been projected and approved by the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph company, according to an announcement made by C. E. Hickman, division commercial superintendent.

This new work will affect many districts, including South Portland, Kings Heights, Arlington Heights, Westover terrace and the business and apartment house districts. Already work has been started to provide greater cable facilities near the city limits of South Portland at a cost of \$10,000 and in the Kings Heights and Arlington Heights districts at a cost of \$5000.

But the projected work is still more comprehensive and consists of three major programs and considerable relief and betterment work whose building is being done on a large scale. The largest project, costing \$60,000, will be started in the district south of Harrison street, about June 1.

In this district, which extends into Fulton and South Portland, vast improvements will be made in the underground plant. About 10,000 feet of 500 pair cable will be laid and a total of about 51,000 feet of underground and aerial cable ranging from 25 to 300 pairs in size, will be placed. This cable will contain 1350 miles of wire. About 200 poles will be placed. The work is scheduled to be completed November 1 and constitutes the largest additions in this section of the city for many years.

On Westover terrace a project costing approximately \$15,000 will be pushed to completion. This work includes the stringing of approximately 5000 feet of aerial cable.

### Ganners Inspect Plant; Will Attend Banquet Tonight

Members of the Northwest Cannery association who gathered here Thursday for their eighth annual convention were learning the details of can manufacturing at the plant of the American Can company this morning and were preparing for the judging and inspecting of canned goods which have been placed on display in the Can company plant.

Business details of the convention were discussed at the meetings Thursday afternoon and evening and the tour and inspection concluding with a banquet at the Malmonah hotel tonight are the final events of the convention program.

Officers were elected as the final step in the business program Thursday afternoon. Mark Ewald of Olympia was elected president to succeed W. G. Allen of Salem, D. J. Matthews of Portland was elected vice president to succeed W. H. Fride of Bellingham, Wash.; C. D. Minton was re-elected secretary-treasurer. Decision was made to increase the directors from three to five and C. J. Clear of Vancouver, Wash., and J. O. Holt of Eugene were selected as additional directors.

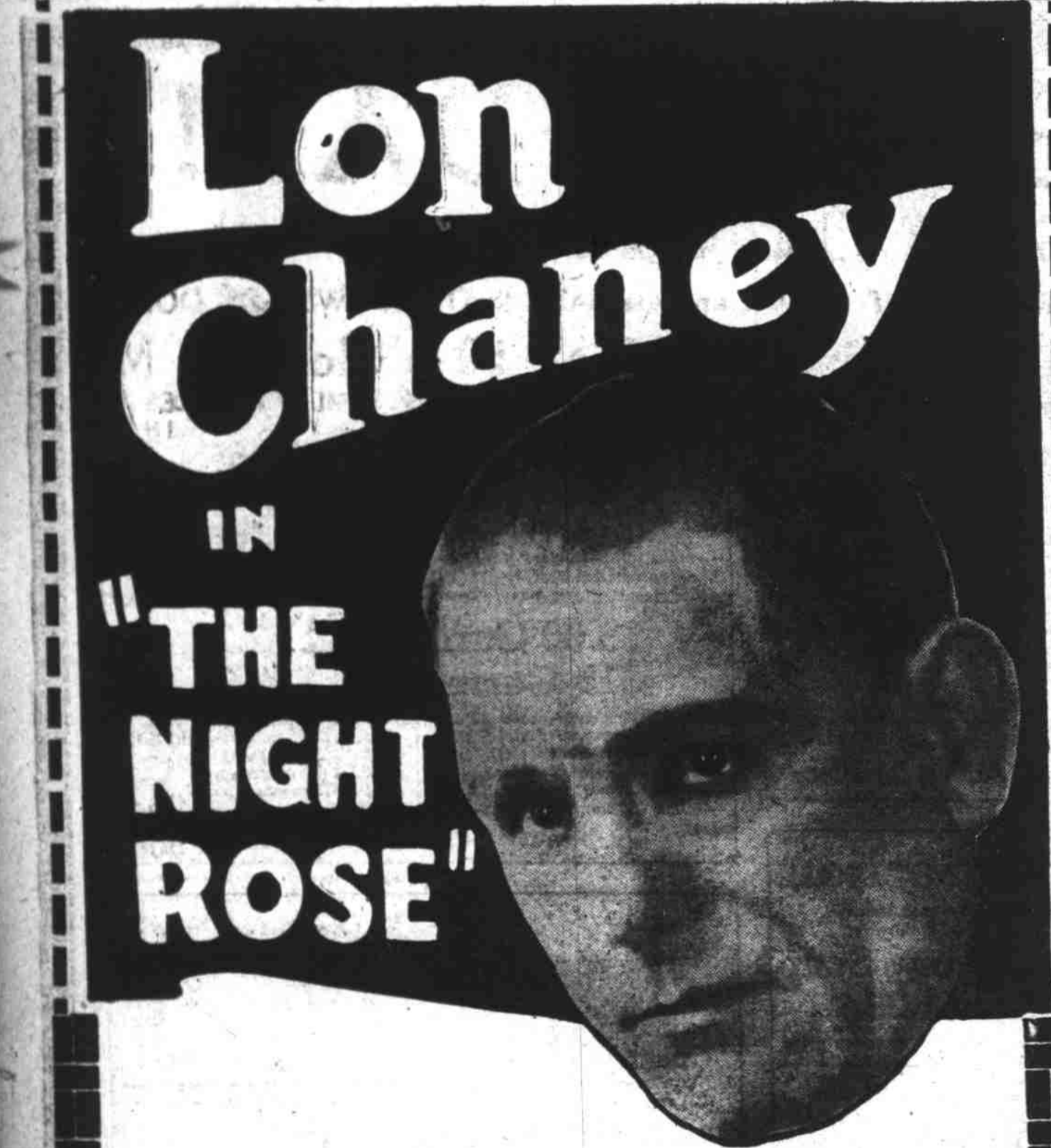
