

Cast Side Baptist Church Converts Sunday School Into Theological Seminary

4 BIBLE SCHOOLS HELD ON SUNDAY

Overcrowded conditions at the East Side Baptist Sunday school have made it necessary for the church trustees to provide additional equipment to care for the rapidly growing school.

The first floor of the building will be used by the best of the department, which numbers 90 children, and the second floor rooms will probably be used by adult classes.

This change means that four simultaneous Bible schools will be held hereafter on Sunday mornings. The intermediate, senior and adult departments will meet in the church building under the supervision of General Superintendent J. A. Smith; the junior department will meet in one-half of the church basement under the supervision of Miss Iva Shelton.

Lesson 7, "The Church and the World," Acts 13: 1-47. Lesson 8, "The Church and the World," Acts 17: 17-34.

Peking University Men to Fill Pulpits

Two Portland pulpits will be occupied Sunday by leading educators from China who have been in attendance at the disarmament conference—the Rev. L. H. Luce, D. D., vice president of Peking university, and the Rev. William Hung.

Luce has devoted his life to higher educational work in China and now is vice president of Peking university—a union school of all Christian institutions of the Chinese city in near Peking.

Dr. Luce graduated from Yale in 1892. While in college he became one of the founders of the student volunteer movement which sent over 500 missionaries to the foreign field in 1897.

Dr. Luce lived in the province of Shantung. He is the author of several books in Chinese, which are widely used in Chinese schools and colleges.
