WEATHER CONDITIONS High pressure prevails over prestically the mitre country, the highest readings being in South Dakota, where the barometer stands nearly in high above normal. Precipitation has occurred over an area reaching from New Mexico Missouri and southward to the Texas coast, and at a few paces in New England, New York, Ush and California. Snow is falling in New Kork, Kansas, Okiahoma, New Mexico and Texas. The temperature is below normal except in the bathastic and Guif states and over a small area in Western Kansas. The deficiency is greatest in the Plains states, where over considerable greas, it amounts to more than 20 degrees.


