

CARELESSNESS OF BONUS APPLICANTS IS CAUSE OF DELAY

Light is shed on the cause of delays in the payment of adjusted compensation to Oregon ex-service men in a report made public today by H. C. Brumbaugh, secretary of the World War veterans' state aid commission. The report shows the number of applications for cash still exceeds the number of applications for bonus.

Out of a total of 20,150 applications, the commission has passed upon 14,717 of these, 6445 have requested loans and 8272 have requested the cash bonus. Approximately 7000 of the applications have been filed with the commission. Before the examination department, however, submits the applications to the commission for final approval, every requirement must be met, and every question of the eligibility of an applicant to receive the benefits of the law must have been carefully considered. All cases which cannot be settled in the examination department are also referred to the commission for final disposition. Every application filed, therefore, receives the consideration of the commission before being rejected or referred to the secretary of state for payment.

APPLICANTS CARELESS

Examinations are made at the rate of about 200 a day. Experience has shown, however, that about 40 per cent of the initial applications filed must be returned to the applicants for correction. This is due partly to the applicant's own carelessness and partly due to circumstances over which he has no control. Out of the total number of applications filed with the commission, 8100 have been returned for correction. No further action upon any individual application thus returned can be taken until the applicant has furnished the necessary correction. Of the total number returned for correction, 2700 are still being held in abeyance due to the fact that the applicants have failed to reply to the letters of the commission. In some cases the applicants have been holding up action upon their own applications since last October.

ANOTHER CAUSE OF DELAY

Another cause for delay in finally disposing of an individual application lies in the fact that an official record of every applicant must be obtained from the offices of the war or navy at Washington, D. C. Now that the appropriations for these departments have been minimized by congress, a long delay sometimes ensues before the record in any individual case can be obtained. The commission, however, has provided for this emergency by approving a plan for the maintenance of clerical help in the offices at Washington, whose sole duty will be the compilation of the necessary records for the commission. Frequently the official records disprove statements made by applicants in their initial applications, and in some cases it becomes necessary to reject their application altogether.

Anti-Narcotic Move Fully Indorsed by Kiwanis Resolution

Kiwanis club ratified at luncheon today in the Multnomah hotel all the resolutions adopted Saturday at the Kiwanis narcotics conference and passed resolutions of its own, urging that the internal revenue department fire more lead than in an attempt to stamp out the traffic in Oregon and that congress pass more stringent anti-narcotics laws. That done, the Kiwanis turned their attention to Dr. Thomas Villers, new pastor of the Baptist church, whose talk was cheerful and satisfying. He told of his first impression of Portland. "I was impressed," he said, "by the brotherliness, enthusiasm, enterprise and altruism of the city."

Man Found Guilty Of White Slavery

Clarence Brewer was found guilty of white slavery this morning in a verdict returned to Federal Judge Bean by a jury empaneled Monday to try him. Brewer was indicted for two alleged offenses, but the jury acquitted him of one charge. He was convicted of transporting Carrie Barboe, a 15-year-old Shetland, Wash., girl from her home to Portland. He was arrested December 12 at 47 East Pine street by the police, where he is said to have lived with the girl. This was Brewer's second trial, the first jury having disagreed. Judge Bean said he would pronounce sentence Wednesday.

Robbers Do Speedy Work in Springfield

Springfield, Or., March 7.—Three robbers were committed this morning between midnight and 1 o'clock. The Stewart & Bennett meat market was robbed of several hundred dollars in silver. The Drop Inn pool hall of considerable cash and merchandise, and across the street from a shooting gallery a small amount of cash and merchandise was taken.

Robert A. Sawyer In Race for County Commissioner's Job

Robert A. Sawyer today made formal announcement of his candidacy for the Republican nomination for county commissioner of Multnomah county. He then located at Portland, and during the Lewis and Clark exposition was first sergeant of the fair guards.

Ten years ago, Sawyer engaged in the meat and grocery business at Third and Everett streets, where he built up a successful business. In addition to his business activities he has served as a member of Scout Young camp and president of the Retail Market Men's association. He is a member of the Elks, Woodmen of the World, Masons and Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Committee to Meet To Name Candidates For Chamber Board

Members of the nominating committee of the Chamber of Commerce were scheduled to meet today to select candidates for the board of directors of the organization in preparation for the annual election to be held April 23. Three members of the nominating committee appointed by the advisory committee are Edgar B. Piper, A. E. Doyle and H. L. Corbett. Three members appointed by the members' forum are F. C. Jones, George Lawrence Jr. and J. P. Jaeger. The seventh member of the committee is H. B. Van Duzer, president of the organization.

Lloyd's Lays Odds Of 5-2-3 to 1 That 'Premier Remains'

London, March 7.—(U. P.)—Premier Lloyd George's attack of bronchial catarrh has not proved serious. At Lloyd's, where they lay odds against everything from raindrops to revolutions, the betting is 5-2-3 to 1 against the premier resigning during March.

The Balfour speech at the Carlton club luncheon today was expected to be the last word regarding Lloyd George's plans. Following Balfour's announcement, which was believed might include hints of a new center cabinet party, the premier was expected to leave for Wales with his wife and daughter.

Consider Transfer To School Board of Health Inspection

Transfer of the medical inspection and supervision for school children from the jurisdiction of the city health bureau to the school board, is being investigated by William F. Woodward, school director, and City Commissioner John M. Mann.

The proposal, announced today by Mann, was that due to the inadequate number of school nurses in the health bureau, five for the whole city, school work could not be carried on as it should be. He proposed that the school board create a staff of nurses and relieve the city officials of the work.

Little Hope Held For William Allard

Little hope is held for the recovery of William Allard, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Allard, 41 East Thirty-first street north, who was stricken with spinal meningitis while attending the University of Oregon. He was resting easily today, however, after an operation at midnight Monday. He was taken ill Thursday and his mother was summoned to Eugene. Later, when he developed alarming symptoms, he was brought to Portland.

Postal Department Course Being Taken

Thomas Thompson, newly appointed postmaster of Pendleton, is in the city taking an intensive course in postal instruction, under the new arrangement created by former Postmaster General Hays. According to the new regulation, all new postmasters in Oregon must report to Postmaster John M. Jones of Portland for a two-day course in all the different phases of work in each of the postal departments.

Albert H. Sylvester, supervisor of the Wenatchee national forest, arrived in the city Monday to attend a conference with District Forester George Cecil, over problems affecting standardization of forest administration.
