

### EPISCOPAL YOUNG PEOPLE, 500,000 STRONG, IS GOAL

Creation of a big, nation-wide organization of upwards of 500,000 young people comprising the various junior societies of the Episcopal church is foreseen in a tentative call which has been issued for an informal conference of the leaders of these societies at Portland, Oregon, next September, during the biennial general convention of the church. Beginning with the war period, in a state of "dormancy" throughout the country, societies of young people have been organized within the church based on the principles of service and self-improvement.

Their meetings are devoted to discussions of public problems, and systematic plans for useful effort in religious, social service and civic activities. **MOVEMENT GAINS**

The movement has spread with such rapidity and with such excellent results that the executive secretaries of the national council of the church, seeing in it great civic as well as spiritual possibilities have laid before the church the suggestion of a national organization in a bulletin which gives the full details of the activities of these societies in the dioceses where they have been organized. For the varied and sometimes conflicting programs of the diocesan bodies a national program would be formulated under the proposed amalgamation.

Rev. Dr. William E. Gardner, secretary of the educational department of the national council of the church, in a summary of the movement says: "The war has brought the young life of the nation forward. Thousands of boys and girls have found it possible to invest their interests and enthusiasms in community and national movements. **PLAN CONTAGIOUS**

"The satisfaction resulting has been contagious and today there are young men and women who desire to see the church 'wake up' as some express it, and utilize that power of youth which the nation has used to such advantage. If the church has made religion and the spiritual life demand too much intrusion for this age of youth," says Dr. Gardner. "If she has failed to outline

tasks that command the service of an age which, if aroused, gives freely, if she has failed to make romantic and thrillingly adventurous the task of building a Christian nation, then let her confess her neglect and call her best young people into cooperation."

### \$500,000 Added to Baptist New World Salvation Campaign

A contribution of \$500,000 to the proposed \$1,000,000 fund to finance the Baptist New World Movement was received today at the New York office of the Northern Baptist association, according to a telegram received by Dr. O. C. Wright, secretary of the Oregon Baptist state convention, from Dr. J. Y. Aitchison, director general of the movement. Approximately \$9,000,000 already had been contributed to the fund by Northern Baptists and it is planned to increase this amount to \$15,000,000 by April 30. Dr. Wright stated, and Oregon's share of the contribution would amount to approximately \$100,000.

Plans outlined for the new world movement call for raising the entire \$100,000,000 by 1924. Approximately an equal amount is to be raised by the Southern Baptists and the money used in promoting the aggressive campaigns for the salvation of the world by the Baptist church.

### State Speed Cops Called Before Judge

Corvallis, April 13.—Two state speed cops who stopped in Corvallis Wednesday parked too close to the city fire hydrants and were required to appear before Judge Conner. The case was delayed until the city attorney's advice was secured. Corvallis and Benton county motorists who have been fined or chucked up by the state officers are taking a keen interest in the outcome.

### E. Johnson's Alibi Doubted; Fined \$250

Elmer Johnson's alibi was not believed by District Judge Deich Wednesday after

arrest and the alleged bootlegger was fined \$250. Johnson explained the 40 gallons of moonshine found in his machine by Highway Patrolman Hamaker, April 8, by saying he was driving along the road when he noticed two men in one auto acting very suspiciously. He stopped his car and they fled, he declared. This he found the liquor when they had cached it and he loaded it into his machine.

### Mortgage Debt on Oregon Farms 88 Millions in 1920

Washington, April 13.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL).—Mortgage debts on owned homes and

farms in Oregon in 1920 was \$88,000,000, representing 24.2 per cent of the total value, according to figures announced by the census bureau. This calculation includes rented homes, tenant farms and farms partly owned and partly rented. There were almost 100,000 city and suburban homes of which 41.1 per cent were owned by occupants and 24.2 per cent were mortgaged, the ratio of mortgage to value being 40.4 per cent.

### Rev. M. A. Matthews Is Named Moderator

Albany, Or., April 12.—Rev. M. A. Matthews of Warm Springs, Eastern

Oregon, was elected moderator of the United Presbyterian Presbytery of Oregon session at Albany, Wednesday. Rev. David S. Sharp, retiring moderator, delivered the opening sermon Tuesday evening. Dr. M. E. Dunn and J. Patton reported on the new world movement congress of the United Presby-

terian church, to which they were delegates. Ten churches, including two at Portland, were represented.
