

PORTLAND START TO CLEAN HOUSE BY MAY 1

Portland will begin its official spring housecleaning May 1.

Commissioners Barbur, Bigelow and Mann have been appointed a special committee to supervise the annual clean-up campaign.

The plan for the campaign as outlined by Commissioner Barbur today is to have the city blocked off into districts.

Inspectors of the building division, the health bureau, the fire marshal's office and the police force will be assigned to each district.

A thorough survey will be made and all lots where an accumulation of debris is found will be posted and the owner notified.

"May day will see the opening of the campaign," he said. "The cooperation of all departments of the city has been secured and there is no reason why Portland should not appear to the summer visitors in the most favorable light."

"Inspection of the building, health, fire marshal's office and the patrolmen of the police force registered cover to the condition of all property on their beats or within their district."

The clean-up campaign organization will continue operation all through the summer, Barbur said, and will be ready to cope with the grass and weed situation later in the summer.

20-Foot June Flood Is Forecast, if Hot Weather Is Dodged

Should normal temperature conditions continue during the remainder of the spring an average June flood level of 20 feet will be reached in the Columbia river at Portland.

Although the precipitation in the Columbia river basin has been below normal generally, the season has been cold and practically the entire snow-pack remains in the mountains.

This report was made today in the final mountain snowfall bulletin of the local weather bureau station, and is based upon the meteorological reports of Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming and British Columbia.

The snow depth is somewhat above normal in the upper drainage area of the Snake and Goddard creeks near Elmer, Oregon, at the headwaters of the Salmon river, and slightly below normal in the area drained by the Clearwater, Kootenai and the upper main portions of the Columbia rivers.

Except for the coast and Siskiyou ranges, the snow depth is everywhere slightly above normal.

Normal flow of water in most of the streams west of the Cascade mountains, and somewhat above normal in those of the east slope of the Cascades and in the Blue mountains, said the report.
