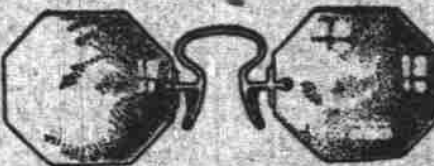
SCHOOL HEADS RETAINED
