

LAST OF OLD CROP ONIONS SELLING AND NEW CROP IS DUE MORE BUTTER IS COMING AT RISE

Many of the leading retailers are today selling extra sets at 25 cents a dozen and the price is going up. This is practically the wholesale price, the fact is that many of the dealers are securing their stock direct from the producer and therefore are buying below the wholesale price.

Because of the excellent Eastern demand there is very little fresh produce offered in the retail shop. The Roseburg stock of the better quality is going east in carload lots and Portland therefore must pay as high a price as others. Local stock is not yet of very good quality but will be in excellent shape within a week or 10 days.

Most grocery stores have reached Portland and next week quite fair supplies are likely. It is not believed that asparagus will sell low this season because of the great damage in California. Canneries there are paying extreme prices for supplies.

Local meat markets generally show:

Butter - Fresh creamer, 40¢ a 40¢ pound; Butter - Salmon, 40¢ a pound; perch, 10¢ a pound.

Fruit - Fresh, 25¢ per pound.

Onions - 10¢ a 10¢ per pound.

Yams - 25¢ a pound.

Cheese - 25¢ a pound.

Meat - 25¢ a pound.

Butter - Butter market, 25¢ a pound.

Meat - Public market, 25¢ a pound.

Meat - Private store, 25¢ a pound.
