DEATH SECRET IS GIVEN UP BY CALAPOOLA

Body Found in Sack Below Albany Bridge; Shot in Back of Head; Garage Man Says He Saw Blood on Hecker's Hand Murder Night... Albany, Or., April 21.—Frank Bowker's body was found this morning in the Calapoola river, about three fourths of a mile down from the bridge from which Russell Hecker, accused of his murder, supposedly dropped it.

The body, clad in overalls over gray trousers and a rain coat, was in a crouching position enclosed in a bag sack. A bullet wound in the back of the head near the left ear, where the bullet entered, and a mark over the right eye, where it emerged, indicates that Bowker was shot from behind on at least when he did not expect such an attack.
