Lumber exports, foreign, again climbed close to the record breaking figures of March. April clearances showed 29,-920,048 feet set afloat with a valuation of \$747,985. Wheat exports for the month unted to 1,603,939 bushels valued at \$2,260,152. Flour shipments dropped to 68,827 barrels valued at 293,083. The Total value of the foreign exports of wheat, flour and lumber for April amounted to \$3,301,220.

As compared with the exports for the corresponding month of last year wheat and flour shipments are short lumber shipments for the month just were approximately three times greater than in April 1921. For the first four months of the year the lumber exports have hovered around the 30,000,000 mark for each month. Lumamounted to only 10,021,676 feet. A year ago the wheat shipments for valuation of \$3,924,412. Flour exports amounted to 124,662 barrels, valued at \$777,649. The season is rapidly drawing to a close and May exports will prac-

tically clean up the grain shipments.


