

Church People to Be Greatest Week of Crusade Expected

Oregon Evangelical Conference Will Be At Tacoma May 4-8

Church people of Portland will be the special guests during the nights of the coming week at the united gospel crusade tabernacle. The week will be the final week of the campaign in Portland.

The annual meeting of the Oregon conference of the Evangelical association will be held at Tacoma May 4 to 8. The conference includes the 25 Evangelical churches in Oregon and the Puget Sound district. This denomination is doing much pioneer work in the Northwest.

Monday afternoon service will be for men only, when Dr. Anderson will speak from the subject, "Grinding Grain for the Devil's Bread." This service is announced for 8 o'clock and will be in the tabernacle at East Third and Irving streets, as will all the other services of the week.

The important item of business scheduled for the conference is the question of organic union of the Evangelical association with the United Evangelical church. To date all of the American churches of the Evangelical association have voted for the union with the Oregon conference of the United Evangelical church, at its recent annual conference.

NO SERVICE MONDAY. No services will be held Monday, the crusader and his party resting that day.
