an overdose of cocaine, has caused a sensation. A Chinese has been held as a witness in the case, when the coroner's hearing is resumed. The press has taken up the campaign against the night clubs and alleges that these places are centers for the distribution of "dope" in London.

**FOREST PLANTING  
OPERATIONS BEGIN,  
TREES ARE READY**

Nearly 50 Men Are at Work at  
Wind River Nursery, Says Ex-  
aminer Kummel.

Nearly 50 men are at work at Wind River nursery, according to J. F. Kummel, forest examiner in charge of planting, who has just returned to Portland after starting spring operations. Thirty men are at work in the nursery, ten are working on the road between the nursery and the main road and ten are at planting operations. In addition, six students from Oregon Agricultural college are making several days stay at the nursery to observe methods.

Young trees have been dug up and are ready to be shipped to the various planting areas and transplanting from the seed beds will start within a day or two.

Kummel on his way out superintended the planting of trees along the road-sides leading to government mineral springs. This is a new thing in forest service planting, and while its primary purpose is to prevent fires from spreading from the road to the surrounding burnt-over land, it will greatly enhance the value of the ride to government

mineral springs from a single stand-point.  
The weather station which Dr. Julius Hofmann is erecting at the experiment station is almost complete, says Kummel. It contains instruments to show the temperature, sunshine, rainfall, wind direction and velocity, evaporation and other weather conditions.  
Kummel will leave Portland within the next few days for the Olympic national forest where he will start planting operations on the old Soldus burn, and for the Rainier forest to superintend planting upon the old Claspus project.

**NEW TARIFF RATES**  
Olympia, Wash., April 29.—A new tariff of rates effective May 1 has been received by the department of public works from the Terminal Dock company of Tacoma. The tariff provides for additional service and shows a slight reduction in the aggregate. It is made to meet the rates of the Port of Tacoma and the Seattle docks.

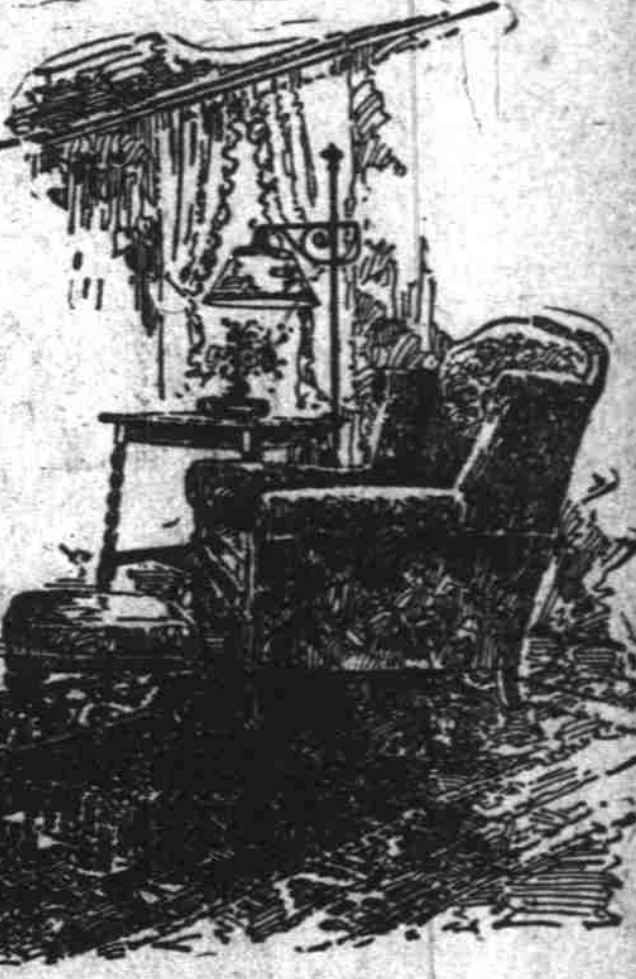

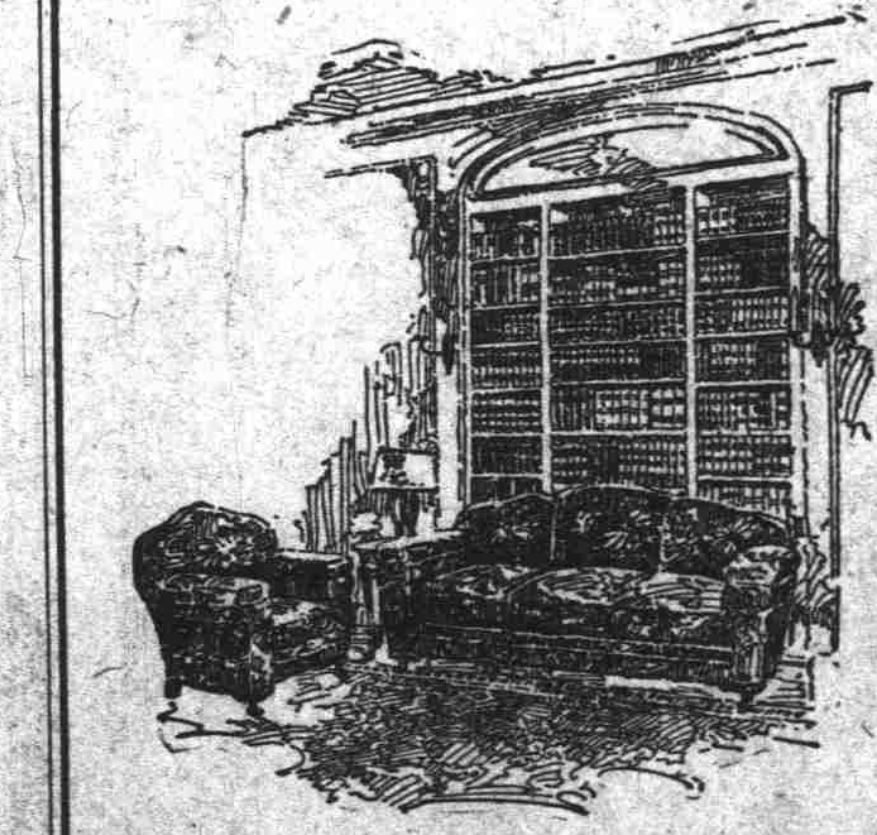
