

MILL OWNERS OF KLAMATH REJECT BOARD'S PROPOSAL

Klamath Falls, May 2.—Lumber operators of the Klamath region in a conference at San Francisco, Monday, announced their unanimous rejection of the eight-hour day, as recommended by the Oregon state board of conciliation, and their intention to resume operations on a nine-hour basis at an early date. The announcement follows:

"The Klamath Falls operators at a meeting in San Francisco were unanimous in the rejection of the Oregon state board of conciliation's recommendations for an eight-hour day and were unanimous in the adoption of the nine-hour day as the only basis of operation. The decision was arrived at after a two days' conference at which every phase of the situation was discussed. The operators were in accord, that while they are not opposed to an eight-hour day, it would not be possible to operate in competition with California mills now working 10 hours if they were handicapped by the eight-hour day."

Thieves Find Safe Combination; Take \$1100 in Money

Veterans' Bureau Takes Charge of Federal Hospitals

(By United News) Washington, May 2.—The entire responsibility for the care of disabled veterans in hospitals now rests with the veterans' bureau. This is the result of an executive order signed by President Harding, transferring to the bureau 57 hospitals now in operation, one surveying depot and nine hospitals under construction which had been under the supervision of the United States public health service. All facilities, property and equipment were transferred. The commissioned personnel of the public health service will be detailed by the surgeon general to the veterans' bureau.

Mrs. Wilson Denies Ex-President Has "One Foot in Grave"

Washington, May 2.—(I. N. S.)—Mrs. Woodrow Wilson today denied that her husband "has one foot in the grave." "Why, he is ever so much better," Mrs. Wilson declared at a tea for the Democratic national committee women gathered here for a conference. It was her first formal appearance since Mr. Wilson's breakdown, and she made it the occasion to deny newspaper reports giving the impression that the former president's illness was serious. Newspaper accounts of Mr. Wilson's appearance at the recent demonstration in his honor by members of the League of Women Voters seemed to distress her. The wife of the former president informed Mrs. George Bass of Chicago, former head of the women's bureau of the Democratic national committee, who expressed a desire to call on Mr. Wilson, that Mr. Wilson would be glad to see her and other Democratic women leaders.

Recall Election Is Officially Called For Primary Day

Salem, May 2.—An official call for recall elections against Fred A. Williams and Fred G. Buchtel, public service commissioners, to be held May 13, at the time of the primary elections, was issued Monday afternoon by Secretary of State Koser. May 8 is the last day on which candidates may file. But two men are mentioned here as possible candidates, Edward M. Cousins and F. S. Myers, former Portland postmaster.

Two separate ballots will be furnished voters in the western district, one for Buchtel, who represents the district, and the other for Williams, elected from the state at large. In the eastern district only the Williams ballot will appear. Voters will pass upon the recall question and also vote on candidates to fill the offices should the recall carry. Secretary of State Koser said that a 200-word statement of reasons for the recall, as given in the petitions, would appear on each ballot and that Buchtel and Williams will each be allowed a similar number of words in which to reply. HEARING ON MERITS The irregularity of the recall petitions filed with Secretary of State Koser and directed against Public Ser-

vice Commissioners Williams and Buchtel will be tried out on merits in the circuit court here. This was made plain here this morning when Attorney General Van Winkle stated that he is preparing answers to the two complaints filed by John H. Carson, district attorney for Marion county, and Roscoe P. Hurst, Portland attorney, representing the Law and Order league of Portland, alleging fraud, misrepresentation and other irregularities in securing the names which compose the two petitions. In his answer the attorney general stated he will take issue with Carson and Hurst on the contention that the act of "depositing" the petition with the secretary of state's office here on April 19

constituted the formal filing of these documents. DENIAL IS PLANNED In the complaint it was pointed out that the Buchtel petition on that date lacked 1600 names of a number sufficient to place his name on the recall ballot. The general denial on "information and belief" will also be entered to the allegation of fraud and misrepresentation in order to bring the issue squarely before the courts on its merits. The complaints allege that in the case of both petitions many of the names were secured through forgery or misrepresentation, that others are entirely illegible, and that the large majority of the names were secured to the petitions so long ago as to make them worthless and a violation of the spirit of the recall law.

It is expected that the answer will be ready this afternoon or Tuesday morning. At the time the court denied the petition for a writ of injunction to forestall the calling of the recall election Saturday afternoon, both Judges Bingham and Kelly signified their readiness to expedite litigation over the recall petitions as much as possible so as to avoid unnecessary delays, should the issue be presented to them in any manner.
