

BORAH WANTS TO QUIZ BAKHMETEFF ABOUT HUGE SUM

It Is Said Senator Would Have ex-
Envoy of Russia Explain Dispo-
sal of \$187,000,000 He Received

(By Universal Service)
Washington, May 6.—Senator Borah demanded in the senate this afternoon that Boris Bakhmeteff, so-called Russian ambassador, appear before a senate committee instead of "hiding behind his diplomatic immunity" and attempting through communications to the state department to clear himself of the serious charges made against him.

Senator Borah made his demand after there had been read to the senate a letter from Secretary of State Hughes, embodying a statement by Bakhmeteff to the state department, denying that he had misappropriated loans obtained from the United States and disavowing any connection with the visit of General Gregorie Semenov.

"It would appear that through some modus operandi and the establishment of what they call a liquidation account that a part of this money at least was used in settling claims against the Russian government, but that those, if they existed, existed against a government which has disappeared and it is difficult to understand how Bakhmeteff could adjust these claims acting as finance minister and claim adjuster and paying out the money which belonged as a matter of fact, if it belonged to anybody at that time, in my opinion, to the government of the United States."

ASH PILE REMAINS TO TELL TALE OF NEGRO MURDERERS

Neighbors of Slain Girl Discuss
Tragedy in Hushed Voices; Wife
Betrays Leader in Cruel Crime.

Kirwin, Tex., May 6.—(U. P.)—A glowing pile of ashes in the courthouse square here tonight marked the spot where three negroes were burned to death by a mob.

The negroes were mutilated and then tied to the funeral pyre after one had confessed to a brutal attack on Eula Aunley, beautiful 17-year-old white girl, and implicated the other two.

Three miles south of here on the John King farm, husband voiced the tale of murder of Eula Aunley, granddaughter of the house, and the subsequent man hunt.

Practically every man within a radius of 20 miles responded to the call to arms when the 17-year-old girl's body was found Thursday night.

Draw King, uncle of the murdered girl, found her body after a long search. It was hidden in a ravine several hundred yards from the road where her horse was grazing.

She lay in a pool of blood, her body stabbed 30 times. Her throat was slashed. King could hardly recognize her. There appeared to be no clue, they as the posse started the search, they passed through the yard of "Snap" Curry, a 20-year-old negro, a fresh washed shirt hanging on the line.

WIFE TELLS OF MURDER
Curry's wife was questioned and finally admitted that Curry told her that he murdered the girl. She said under the threat of death she helped him wash the blood from his clothes. She said he threatened to kill her if she told. Curry himself was a member of the party who discovered the body. He accompanied one of the posse four hours before he made his vain break for liberty.

Mae Jones, 44, and John Cornish, 19, fellow workers on the John King farm, and friends of Curry, were arrested on suspicion and lodged in jail.

All day Friday the hunt continued. Curry was finally captured through the cunning of Harry Spence, of his own race. Spence met Curry on the road to Wortham and Curry accepted an invitation to ride with Spence on his horse.

Wilson Foundation Gifts Not Exempted From Income Taxes

Washington, May 6.—(I. N. S.)—Secretary of the Treasury Mellon decided today that Internal Revenue Commissioner Blair interpreted the law correctly when he ruled that money contributed to the Woodrow Wilson Foundation was not exempt from taxation under the income tax regulations.

Mellon's decision was made known in a letter to Senator Carter Glass of Virginia, in which he said that Blair's order was held in abeyance to give the Wilson Foundation time to perfect its organization so that it could get the exemption which he desires.
