

BIBLE TEACHERS

An interdenominational institute for leaders and teachers of daily vacation Bible schools in Portland will be held on the evenings of May 22 and 23 at Centenary-Wilbur community house, East Ninth and Ash streets, under the auspices of the committee of religious education of The Portland Council of Churches. At this institute the workers will be able to obtain information from those who have had experience in the organization and practical work of the various denominations.
