Pooling of Willamette valley wools appears to
be the solution to the present inability of holders
of small clips to secure adequate values on their
fleeces, considering what is being freely inferred
and paid for the finer wools of Eastern Gregon. Eastern Washington and Idaho, as well as in Montana.

Main difficulty in securing reasonable prices for the coarser cities of the Williamette valley has been in the very smallness of the individual offerings which have necessitated the buying of this stock and assembling at additional expense. On the basis of what has been freely offered and paid for Inland Empire fiseces, Williamette valley coarse wools are worth around 80c a pound and should be freely picked up at that price providing the lots were not so small as to make assembling too coatly.

This price would not be available for so-called braid wool which shows a limited demand and for which prices are not above 20c a pound.
