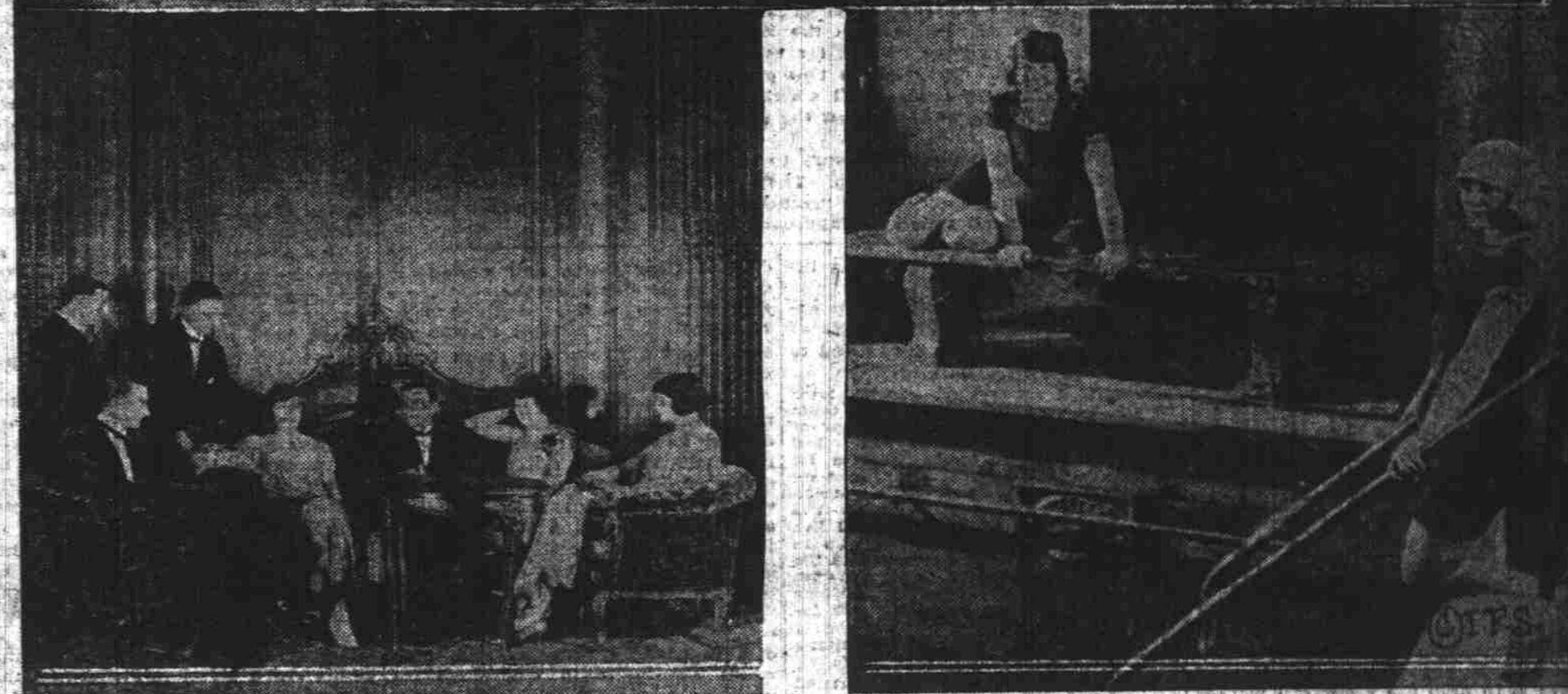
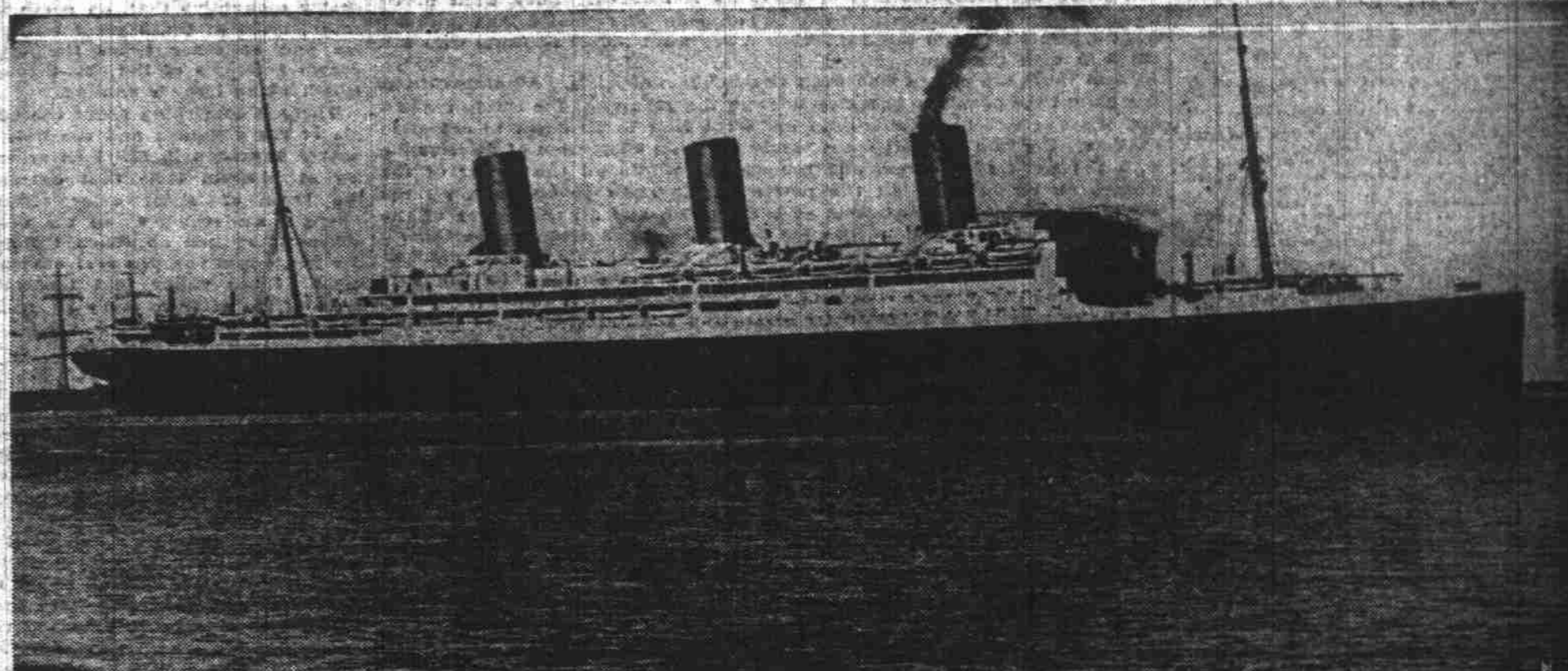

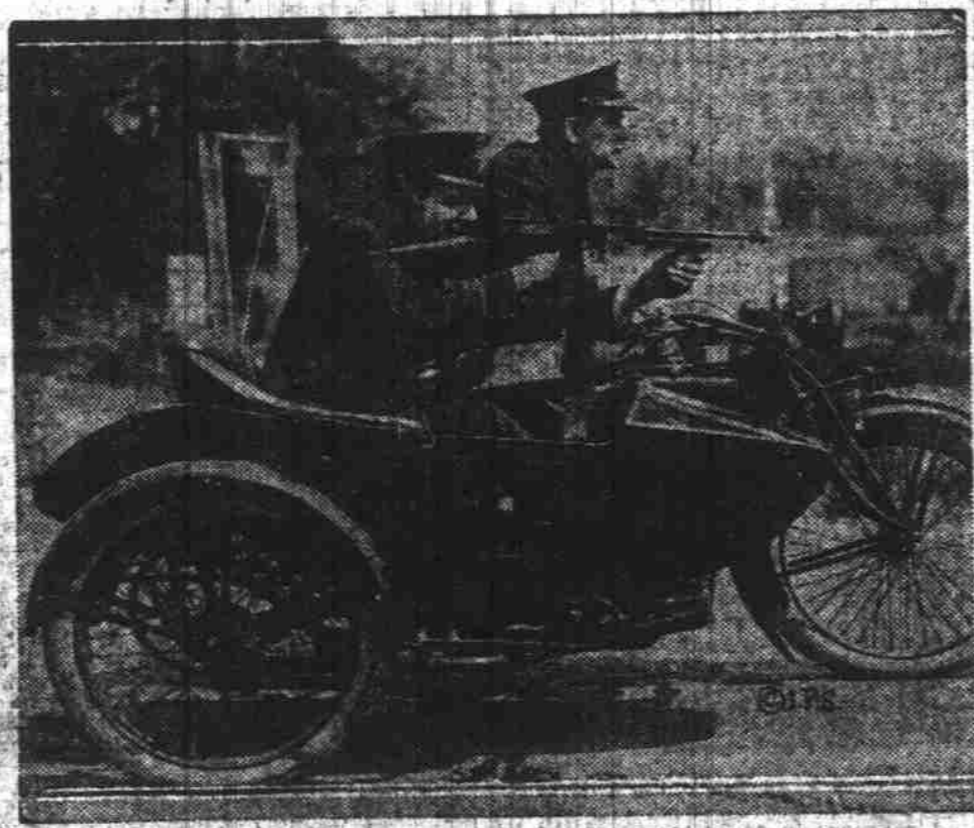

White Star liner Majestic, a 26,000-ton craft, which reached New York on her maiden voyage last week, and views of her swimming pool and luxurious lounge.



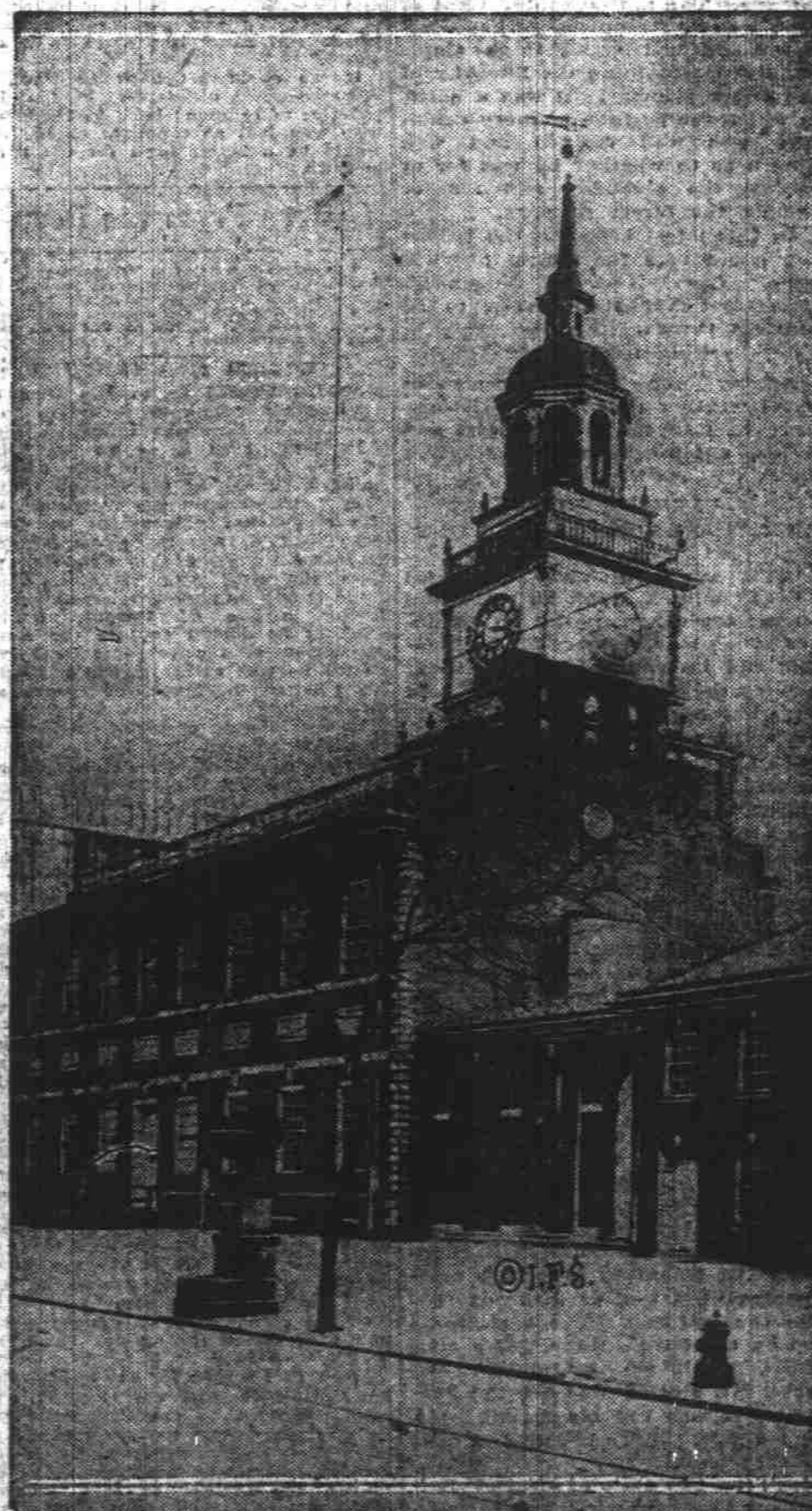
This California mermaid cannot miss a word, so she carries her radio set with her.



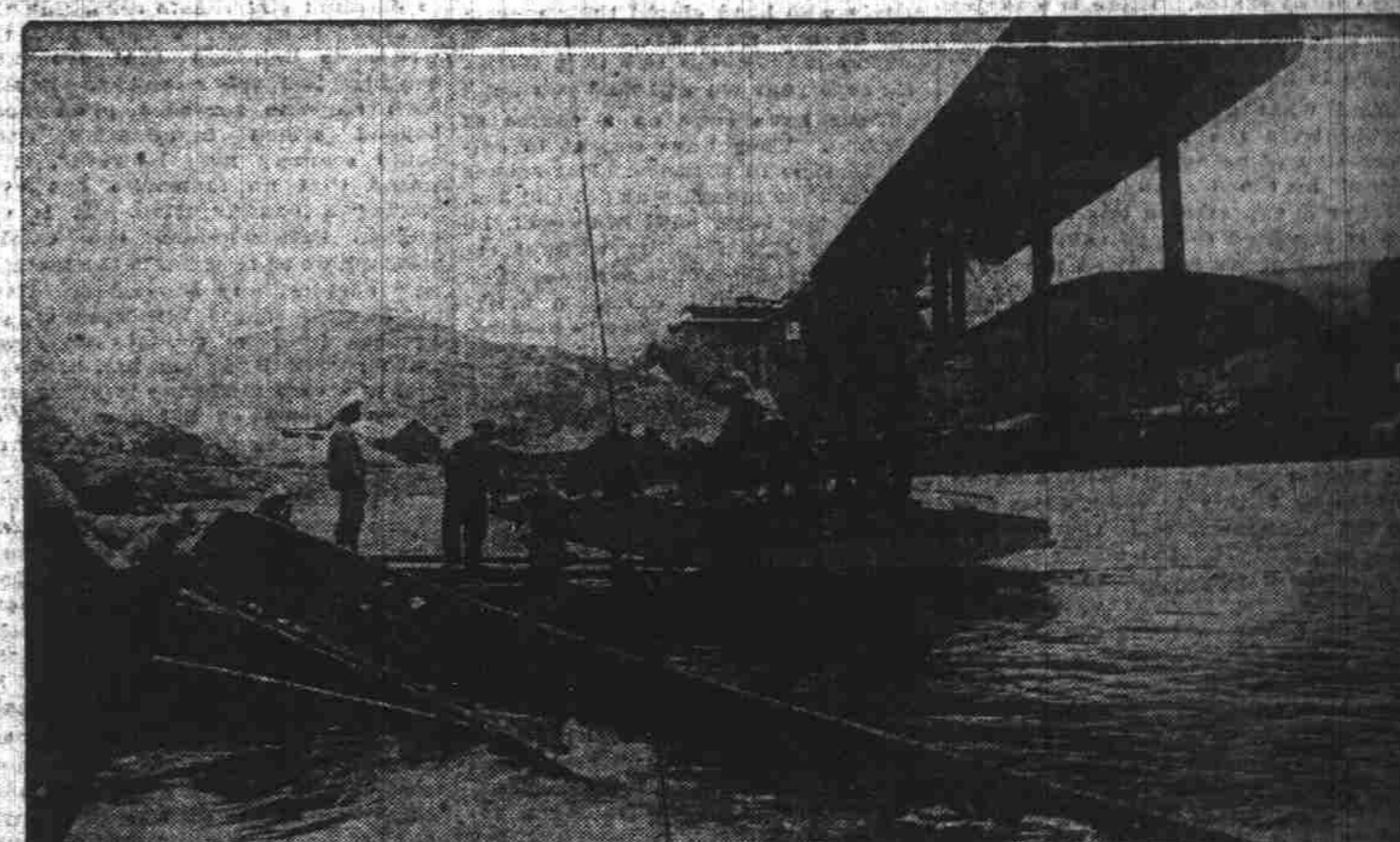
New York police bureau motorcycle equipped with radio outfit and machine gun.
