

SEVEN PROTESTANT FOLLOWERS KILLED IN BELFAST FIGHTS

Military Rule May Be Resorted To by Northern Government; to Report Facts to London.

Belfast, May 20.—(U. P.)—Thousands of republican rebels, working out an organized plan to resist for some time the advance of Catholics, spread terror through Belfast today, murdering and pillaging in a score of northern villages. Seven Protestants were murdered in Belfast and eight others shot, while the day's toll of life in the northern province was 13. Unlicensed property, police barracks, railroads, banks and county seats were blown up, burned and pillaged over a wide area. The Ulster cabinet met with Sir James Craig to take action to check the situation. Martial law in Belfast and "mild" military rule throughout Ulster probably will be determined upon by the northern government. The cabinet announced after a consultation with the military police that the necessary steps to cope with the situation had been decided upon. Lord Londonderry departed for London to acquaint imperial authorities with the nature of the action to be taken.

hole to put the inmates into a deep sleep. But even there his caution did not end. He carried with him a small mat, a single thickness of felt between paper, to deaden the sound of the falling key. Why the "Blue Book Burglar" abandoned his methods is a mystery, the authorities say. They found his body lying beside a fence, which he managed to scale after using his usual method of Charles Pfautz, a former army captain and a crack pistol shot. The vials of quality steel saws strapped to his legs, were there as before. Prochowaki always carried a small box stamped and addressed to himself under a fictitious name ready to receive the loot. He never carried the jewelry on his person after robbing a house, but hid it in a small box at the rear of a mail box. He had no such box when killed. This strengthens the theory that Prochowaki sought to loot the Blair home of its fine paintings, among them several old masters, when he was detected by Miss Anita Blair, daughter of the street car magnate, who summoned Pfautz, the guard. **HAD BLUE BOOK** Prochowaki was sentenced to Joliet in May, 1917, after he had been convicted of entering and robbing a score of homes along the old "Gold Coast." In his room, where more than \$20,000 in jewels and money were found, was a "Blue Book" which was never known to have a confederate. He had, Gus Zeldier, like himself a university graduate, is still serving time at Joliet prison.

It was decided that we should separate and that Mrs. Valentino would return to her parents in New York and that I would remain in California and go on with my work. Having lived for a short time in New York before coming to California

and knowing that many marriages were consummated in New Jersey, just across the line, I supposed the same condition existed in California. **DISCLAIMS BAD INTENTIONS** "I have no intention and had no intention of violating the laws of California, nor did Mrs. Valentino. As soon as the year shall have expired we shall re-marry and in the meantime we shall adhere strictly to the laws. It is needless to say that this year of delay will not in any way lessen our love for each other. "I can truthfully say that my conduct in Los Angeles has been such that no one could question the fact that I have lived a straightforward and honest life. "I regret deeply that I should have done anything that would lower me in the estimation of the American people who have been so kind to me and have accepted me at every turn for more than I conceive to be my real worth, and who have graciously called me 'the lover of the screen.' French Exercising Strict Censorship On Syrian Reports

Cairo, May 20.—Copies of a pro-French Arabic newspaper arriving from Damascus today demonstrated the strictness of the French censorship of news circulating in Syria. Out of ten columns of space devoted to news nine were entirely blank, their contents having been deleted by the censor. Among the items the paper was permitted to print was one concerning the sentencing of a man of 25 years and of a boy of 17 to four and five years imprisonment respectively for "inciting foreign nations to hostilities against France." Another item published was that the United States was among the foreign powers under the influence of two obscure Syrians.
