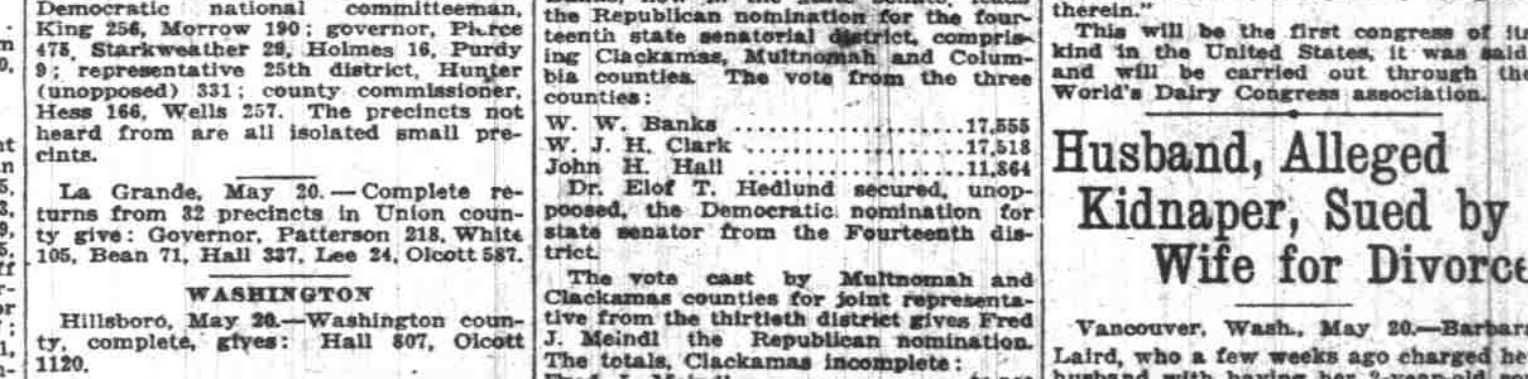
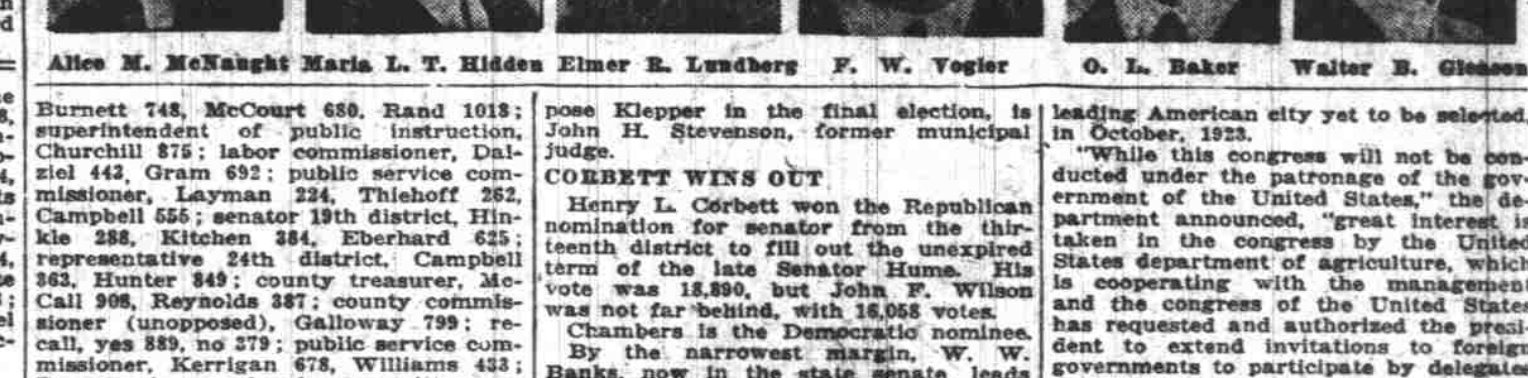
Maurice Crumpacker put a courteous and chivalrous finish to his congressional campaign yesterday afternoon by calling in person upon Congressman McArthur,
