

LINFIELD COLLEGE CLOSING ITS MOST SUCCESSFUL YEAR

"Linfield college is closing the most successful year of the 64 since it was established," said Dr. Leonard W. Riley, president of the institution, which was formerly known as McMinnville college, while in Portland Thursday.

"During the year we have received the \$250,000 endowment gift from Mrs. F. E. R. Linfield of Spokane; we have paid a total of about \$20,000 in debts, thereby removing every dollar of indebtedness which had been against the college, and we have met the entire expense of operating the college during the year amounting to \$51,000. We have had 248 students, 206 of them taking the full college course as compared with 161 last year. Our freshman class numbered 83 this year, the largest entering class in our history. We will graduate 28 students on June 4, which is the largest graduating class in our history.

"Next year we will have seven new members of the faculty, three of them in addition to the present number. I have just received by wire the acceptance of Dr. William James Sly, for many years in charge of religious education of the American Baptist Publication society, as professor of Bible and religious education at Linfield. Other faculty appointments include: Dr. George R. Varney as professor of public speaking, who comes from Oregon Agricultural college; Professor Richard C. Spencer, who will have charge of a new department of political and social science and business administration and who comes from Pacific university; Miss Delos M. James of Chicago university, who will have charge of the department of biology and geology; Miss Anna L. Beebe, graduate of Northwestern university, who will have charge of the voice department, and Miss Alicia Clement, who also comes from Northwestern university, and who will be dean of the conservatory of music and teacher of piano. Miss Clement was for five years professor of the conservatory of music of Albany college. There is to be a new department of chemistry, the professor of which will be announced soon after the close of our school year. We will have next year the strongest faculty in the history of Linfield college."

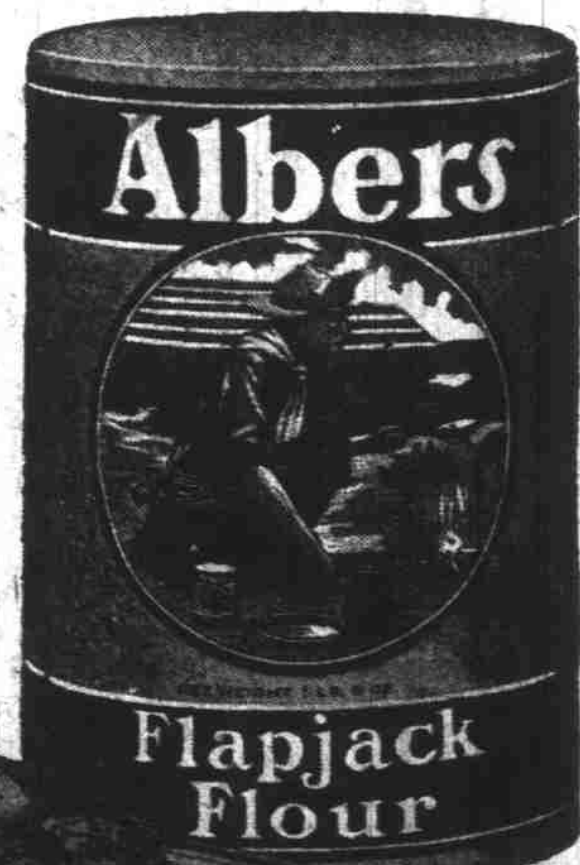
