

WILL REPUBLICAN MACHINE IN IOWA KNIFE BROOKHART?

Washington, June 8.—Ominous silence of Republican leaders at the knockout scored by Smith Brookhart, Progressive, against the organization in Iowa's senatorial primary Monday has led to this question in high political quarters here:

"What will the Iowa Republican organization, under control of Senator Rawson and Senator Cummings do toward electing Brookhart?"

Brookhart and Cummings, after a long friendship, have become bitter political enemies and in their senatorial contest two years ago they fought it out on the Each-Cummings railroad law as an issue. President Harding, then a candidate, spoke publicly for Cummings, declaring the railroad bill the best piece of legislation of its kind ever passed by congress. Brookhart favors repeal of that law.

KNIFE IS THREATENED

While Senator McCormick, chairman of the senatorial campaign committee, has declared the national will cooperate with the state organization toward Brookhart's election, the Iowa state organization is yet to be heard from.

There has been a persistent report current among well informed politicians at the capital here for some time that if Brookhart were to win the primary, he would be knifed at the polls in November.

It was pointed out that Clyde L. Herring, the Democratic senatorial nominee, is not only considered a safe and conservative business man in Iowa, but he numbers among his most intimate friends strong leaders in the Rawson-Cummings wing of the Iowa Republican party.

It is declared by these same informants here that Republican business men particularly would vastly prefer to see Herring elected in November, even though a Democrat, than to send Brookhart to Washington, whom they regard as "a radical."

HERRING'S CHANCES LOOM

Were organization forces to slash the Brookhart vote, therefore, as is deemed entirely possible, there might be a chance of Herring being elected. The situation is interesting further in that the attitude of the organization of Iowa constitutes the third case to develop thus far in senatorial primaries where individuals have shown their power to insure a Democratic candi-

date instead of a Republican of whom they do not approve.

Samuel McCall has this opportunity in Massachusetts to pay back an old score.

In North Dakota if Senator McCumber wins the senatorial primary contest, Lynn Fraser may go into the fall elections as an independent. Such action would practically clinch the election of J. F. O'Connor, the Democratic nominee.

Wallace Smead to Get Heppner Job
