

FEAR EUROPEAN CRISIS IMPENDS AS LENIN SINKS

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Washington, June 8.—Nikolai Lenin, dictator of Russia in the regime of bolshevism, can be considered as eliminated.

Positive advices reaching this country by cable reveal the development of a crisis in Russian affairs which must inevitably affect the whole of Europe. Brain trouble—some reports say, a paralytic stroke, others say a cerebral breakdown—is taking Lenin out of the situation if not out of the world altogether. Predictions vary as to whether he will live. Some reports indicate Lenin cannot last ten days more. CONSIDERED UNFORTUNATE

But in any event the active career of Nikolai Lenin is at an end. Unfortunately this is bad news for the world because while Lenin was far from beloved by the statesmen of other countries, it is a fact that he had made more definite strides toward meeting the viewpoint of European countries than any man in the bolshevik regime. Fears are expressed in the same advices which have reached here that the elimination of Lenin will mean the loss of all progress made by Lenin towards harmonizing the Russian viewpoint with that of other countries.

NONE TO TAKE THE PLACE
No leader appears who is ready to take up Lenin's policy of slow but steady reconciliation with the powers of Europe. Rather it is feared that the leaders who favor a policy of absolute communism, which means permanent isolation, will get the upper hand. Leon Trotsky, minister of war, who, together with Lenin, helped to establish the present regime, is more likely to force his views on the existing government. The minister of foreign affairs, George Tchitcherin, who presented the Russian viewpoint at Genoa and who knows what the viewpoint is of the allied and associated powers, may be an influence for the betterment of Russia's relations with the outside world if Lenin is eliminated. But the greatest uncertainty surrounds the situation. Lenin's death would mean complications inside Russia which will, for a long time, delay the formation of a definite policy outside Russia.

TENDENCY CONSERVATIVE
Of the two elements in the Russian regime, Lenin represented a more conservative tendency, a willingness to go far toward recognizing the sanctity of private property. The communists have been admittedly restraining Lenin whose speeches flurried with the outside world have been the subject of bitter controversy within Russia.

There is the possibility that Lenin may try to hold on even in an enfeebled condition, just as Woodrow Wilson did in the last year of his administration. But with the elements in Russia clamoring for action it is more likely that a serious illness will mean his immediate elimination from the government.

GLOOMY FOR CONFERENCE
Opinion here seems well defined that The Hague conference called as a sequel to the Genoa meeting to investigate the Russian situation now will come to naught. The policy of France in laying down certain principles in advance which permit of little flexibility and the tendency of Belgium to join France, while the United States holds aloof from The Hague meeting altogether, will make an investigation a purely perfunctory affair. It is possible that between now and the time of The Hague meeting a change in personnel will be effected at Moscow and that a successor to Lenin will be in power. This would alter the whole face of things and give the allied powers a timely excuse for postponing the whole conference until it can be determined whether Russia will turn toward the left of radicalism or the right of conservatism and whether a conference of the allies can ward off the one and encourage the other.
