Bonham returned to Portland with his prisoner Saturday night. This completes the capture of the trio of Chinese smuggled into this country by an organized ring, which extracted large sums for services. Bonham, a few weeks ago, captured the other two, who told willingly of the money they had paid to be smuggled into the

United States.

Louie Hauk's case was unusually difficult, Benham said Saturday night. The captain of the vessel, whether purposely or by accident, gave Bonham the wrong photograph. Bonham went to the hop ranch, remotely located at the end of a long sane, where nobody would have occasion to pass unless he had definite business with the ranch.
