

OUSTED FROM JOB BECAUSE OF KLAN, ELLSWORTH GLAD

Pendleton, June 22.—Dr. R. C. Ellsworth, deposed as president of the Oregon state board of chiropractic examiners, has made public the text of his letter to Governor Olcott on which the governor based his dismissal of Dr. Ellsworth "for the good of the service."

I have for acknowledgement your letter of the 7th inst., which just reached me a few moments ago and in which you ask if I am a member of the Ku Klux Klan and if so you request my resignation as president of the Oregon state board of chiropractic examiners.

As I dictate this to you, governor, I wonder why you did not ask me if I were a member of the Masonic fraternity, the Knights of Pythias, the Elks, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the United Spanish War Veterans or any of the other fraternal organizations of which I am a member.

QUESTIONS GOVERNOR'S RIGHT
So long as an organization of which I have the honor to be a member is a law-abiding one and tends to the uplift of mankind and the pursuit of happiness, I question the right of anyone, including your excellency, to criticize or dictate to me relative to my membership therein. I have never before been advised that it was a crime, as your letter infers, for an American citizen to be a member of an all-American organization. However, if subscribing to an oath of unqualified allegiance to the government of the United States of America, its flag and its constitutional laws above any other government, civil, political or ecclesiastical in the whole world and renouncing allegiance of any degree or nature to any foreign government, nation, political institution, sect, people or person is a crime; if the promulgation of free public schools is a crime; if the protection of pure womanhood is a crime; if the desire for white supremacy in a white man's country is a crime; or the demand for American school teachers to instruct American children in a crime; if the practical fraternal fellowship of men whose standard is worth not wealth, character not cash, and courageous manhood based upon honor untarnished by the touch of hypocrisy or the veneering of a society's selfish social valuations is a crime; or in short, if being a member of an organization whose criterion of character is based upon that of a living Christ, then I am a criminal and thousands of the best respected citizens from every walk in life in this good old state are criminals and the majority of officers of the state, elective and appointive are criminals.

REFUSES TO RESIGN
My services for the past seven years on this board have been honest, faithful, unbiased and conscientious and I have helped to make this board the criterion for similar boards in many states, and while I neither expect nor desire further consideration at your hands, I feel that my resignation tendered on the grounds suggested by you would, in a measure, be a confession or rather an admission of wrong doing or malfeasance, hence I prefer that you proceed with my removal from this board in the regular mode, stating, as you will of course, your reason for the action.

I was not surprised by receipt of your letter, as I was advised yesterday that it was enroute. However, it is beyond the comprehension of your best friends why a man who was as clean, square and unspotted as you were when you became a member of this board, could allow himself to be enticed into such a filthy mess of political garbage.

To the thinking minds of Oregon, you occupy one of the positions, viz: either you are not familiar with the basic principles of the organization which you consider, or you are not in sympathy with the movement for all-American free public schools; you do not believe the allegiance to the United States and the American flag should come first; that America should be for Americans first and not for the dross from the melting pot, or else you do know that the principles of the K. K. K. are right and just and you are in sympathy with them, but for reasons which are not commendable you have been induced to crucify your love of country, justice, Americanism and your conscience upon the cross of political ambition.

Summarily, I have absolutely no regrets so far as am concerned, personally. On the contrary, I deem it an honor to be relegated, for the present, to the political chattering together with such worthy men as Charley Gates, mayor of Medford, and Bert Anderson, late member of the state fish and game commission.
