New York, July 6.—Today's decline in the cotton market was in part the further natural reaction from the excessive rise on Monday, following the government erop figures and in part the response to a highly favorable review net loss of 47 to 57 points.

New Yerk, July 6.—The failure of Monday's official crop figures to inspire any general trade or investment demand for cotton was reflected in the action of prices here again today. There was no active aggressive selling but the opening was 12 to 23 points lower under a clearance of scattering liquidation, and the market sold off with net losses some 35 to 45 points after the publication of a favorabe weekly report of the weather bureau. This break carried the price of October contracts off to 22.50, or 78 points below the high record established in the late trading of Monday and there appeared to be a little more buying at the dadine, as a result of which prices rallied a few points. The impression is growing in some quarters, however, that the trade secured enough cover on the buying movement which preceded the publication of end-June crop figures to hold off pending a closer view of the new crop outlook or some change in weather conditions in the best. New York, July 6.—Spot cotton was quiet, 55 points lower at 22.70c. Delivared on contract, 1500 bales. The market closed weak at a net decline of 47 to 62 points.
