WEATHER CONDITIONS

High pressure prevails in the Atlantic and Gulf states, in Nebraska and Kansas, and on the extreme North Pacific coast; the remainder of the country the pressure is low, the principal depressions being central in Arizona, Northwestern Washington and the Upper Snake region. Precipitation has been mostly confined to the Idaho region and Upper Mississippi valley, having been heaviest at Des Moines, Iowa, where it reached 1.42 inches. Much cooler weather obtains over area, reaching from Utah to Minnesota, while to New England it is much warmer. The temperature is 14 degrees below normal in Western Nebraska; 11 degrees above normal in Eastern Washington.

In the letter Lonergan said: "It was entirely due to the very splendid and intelligent manner in which the whole matter was handled by the officers detailed in this case that Russell Hecker was finally brought before the bar of justice and convicted of murder in the first degree."

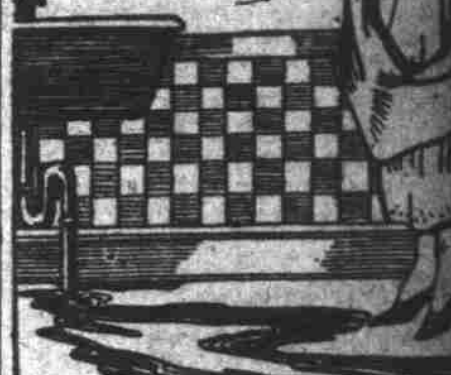
