

DEMOCRATS SA IN RATING—BUT JOB IS HELD UP

Washington, July 13.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL).—Congressman Hawley has made no recommendation to the postoffice department as yet in the matter of the Milwaukee, Or., postmaster, and it is said that no action may be taken for a time.

This delay is evidently the direct result of the examination held by the civil service, which gave Bernard L. Hageman, the present postmaster, the high rating of 91 points and his nearest rival only 70.7. Hageman is a Democrat, and although the law is ahead on the merit basis, his appointment would do violence to the administration principle of "postmaster-ship for Republicans only."

When the outcome will be is not forecasted. In some similar cases, ratings have been ordered and "mistakes" discovered which would bring a Republican candidate to the front. In other cases excuse has been found for ordering a new examination.

MILWAUKIE CITIZENS ARE NEARLY ALL FOR HAGEMAN

Up around Milwaukee peeped are entirely in the dark about the postmaster-ship. They are wondering why Congressman Hawley does not take some action, especially in view of the fact that, practically speaking, the entire town has gone on record in recommendation of the reappointment of Bernard L. Hageman, the present postmaster, and the high man in the rating given applicants for the position.

Hageman was appointed to the postmaster-ship eight years ago, his term expiring on January 24 next. His services have been eminently satisfactory to the business community and general patrons of the office during all of that time, as is evidenced by the very general support given him through universally signed recommendations forwarded to Washington urging his retention in the office.

Some time after Hageman's term expired, notice was given that one of the "reviewer" examinations would be held preliminary to the election of a postmaster for the ensuing term.

There were but three applicants for the job, Hageman, John Towler, one of the mail carriers of Milwaukee, and F. W. Bell, who runs a chicken ranch and raises pigeons near Milwaukee.

After the agents of the department had made their investigations they reported Hageman stood at the top of the list with 91 points in his favor, Bell was far behind with 70.7, while Towler was third.

In spite of his high rating and desire of the patrons of the office, Hageman's appointment has been held up by Hawley. Hageman, though admittedly a good postmaster of more than eight years' experience, is a Democrat.
