

SITES OFFERED HERE FOR HOME BEING INSPECTED

Inspection of sites offered in Oregon for the location of the \$2,000,000 children's home planned by the Brotherhood of American Yeomen, was made on Monday by A. M. Farmer of Detroit, chairman of the children's home movement of the brotherhood, who arrived Sunday night to look over strategic locations in Western Oregon.

The Brotherhood of American Yeomen, which is a nation-wide benefit organization, plans to purchase from 1000 to 1200 acres of land in one of the Western states, upon which will be erected the national children's home of the fraternity at an initial expenditure of upwards of \$2,000,000. A thorough canvass of all Western states is being made in person by A. M. Farmer, high official in the order.

Farmer has just concluded an inspection of proposed sites in Washington, and will inspect Oregon thoroughly before proceeding south. M. J. Duryea, organization and service secretary of the state chamber, will conduct the party over the Columbia River highway today. The first meeting was held at Gresham at noon yesterday, followed by a meeting at Newberg at night.

Other towns to be visited in Western Oregon include McMinnville, Salem, Eugene, Roseburg and Medford. Data has been gathered by the state chamber relative to the natural advantages of the various sections, but the personal investigations of the party itself in the different sections of the state will prove to be the deciding factor in any action taken, it was announced.

The party was entertained at luncheon at the Chamber of Commerce today.

ENGLAND AND U. S. SOLVE MANDATES

(By Universal Service)
London, July 18.—Following a fortnight's conversation with Lord Balfour, chief of foreign affairs in the absence of Lord Curzon, Ambassador Harvey yesterday announced a perfect agreement had been reached on all mandates.

The United States interests will be adequately safeguarded and her national will be guaranteed equal concessions and exploitation privileges with members of the League of Nations. According to the opinion of an American official here, this disposes of the last difficulties between the two countries in the Mesopotamian concessions which have been bothering Washington and Downing street ever since England accepted the mandate from the league.

The agreement between Ambassador Harvey and Lord Balfour will take the form of a treaty subject to ratification by the meeting of the league council in London which began Monday.
