

### CAMPBELL'S LOSS STINGS OLD GUARD REPUBLICAN HEADS

#### Upset in Congressional Election in Kansas Spoils Plans of Leaders to "Put One Over."

(By Universal Service)  
St. Louis, Aug. 5.—The defeat of Congressman Phil Campbell in the third Kansas district last Tuesday is not only the biggest single job the old guard forces at Washington have thus far received in the primaries this year, but has dislocated elaborate plans for the shelving of Speaker Gillett in the next congress, according to information from Pittsburg, Kan.

The report brought to St. Louis by party leaders, is that Campbell was being groomed quietly but on an extensive plan for the speaker's office by some of the administration leaders as a part of the program to placate the insurgency of the Middle Western states.

#### UPSETS WORRY G. O. P.

With the upsets in Indiana, Pennsylvania, Iowa and North Dakota coming so closely together, the standpat element in the national Republican committee, it is reported, became alarmed and sought some program that might stem the tide before the 1924 election. One of the expedients hit upon, it was said, was the selection of a Western man for the speakership of the house.

#### CAMPBELL DEFEAT SHOCK

That Campbell was in danger of defeat was not considered even a remote possibility. But the Kansas industrial court issue, the coal and the railroad strikes did the business, together with the opposition of Campbell to an investigation of the psychological effect of quieting the Progressive anti-administration uprising west of the Allegheny mountains was the dope put out by some of the party managers, it is reported, and things unraveled for the placing of the skids under Speaker Gillett.

George, according to Christman, was hired by Columbia Dick to help kill Starr, who had been released on the day of the murder from jail where he had served time for alleged theft of Dick's squaw. Christman asserts that Dick, fearing to stay Starr alone, employed by George to assist. Nannie Annie, a squaw not recognized by her own people, is in jail and another witness is known who, according to Christman, will testify that they saw Dick and George beat Starr to death and cut the body in pieces. Dick has not yet been located.
