

HUSBAND FACES DESERTION AND BIGAMY CHARGE

Dewey Lane, alias William A. Storey, 23 years old, alleged bigamist and the father of a 4-year-old girl, is in the city jail on a charge of desertion from the United States army and will be turned over to the federal authorities as soon as his record can be checked.

A letter was received at police headquarters from Mrs. Bernice Pauline Lane, Bragg City, Mo., asking if the department could locate her husband, Dewey Lane, whom she last saw in February, 1920, when he enlisted in the army at a Missouri post.

Mrs. Lane stated she wanted her husband back and asked for immediate help in finding him as he was needed at home. On April 9, 1922, a youth giving the name of William A. Storey was arrested by Police Inspectors Horack and Hamrick on a charge of forging a check for \$25. The machinery of the detective bureau was put in motion and Detective Joe Morak went to the Montgomery apartments, East Eighth and Morrison streets, and arrested Lane, who was living with his second wife under the name of W. A. Storey.

LANE TELLS STORY

Lane told the whole story to the inspector.

He said he was married in 1916 in Missouri and a baby girl was born to that union. Six months after birth of the child he enlisted in the army and was shortly afterward transferred to Camp Lewis, Wash. Lane told the police he tried repeatedly to get a furlough to go to his home, but was refused and decided to desert in April, 1921.

Since that date, he said, he has written his wife several times and received no answer. He declared that he had received a letter from a friend near the Missouri home town, who told him his wife had obtained a divorce.

FORGOT HE HAD WIFE

"I worked around Portland," he said, "forgetting that I had a wife and that I had gone over the hill" from the army. I met Miss Elo Thompson, No. 740 Belmont street, and we decided to get married. I told her that I had been married and that my wife had obtained a divorce but she did not know that I was a deserter from the army until Morak arrested me before her.

Lane and Miss Thompson were married less than two weeks ago in Vancouver, Wash. According to the police, a friend of Miss Thompson falsely swore before the marriage clerk that the bride was 2 years of age, while as a matter of fact she is but 16.

INTENDED TO LEAVE

Lane told the police that he and his wife would have been gone from Portland to a new job in Eastern Oregon within 24 hours, had he not been arrested.

Owing to the difficulty of getting Mrs. Lane No. 1 to come to Portland to prosecute a case against her husband if she cared to do so, Captain Harms of the detective bureau dismissed the charge of bigamy and held Lane for the government. Mrs. Lane No. 2 was turned over to the women's protective division for proper care.

**Japanese Invasion
Of Arbor Lodge Is
Resented at Meet**

Strenuous opposition to Japanese invasion of Arbor Lodge district featured a mass meeting of residents and property owners in the neighborhood of Portland boulevard and Greeley street Monday night. The meeting was held at Arbor Lodge hall and among the principal speakers were Elton Watkins, candidate for congress on the Democratic ticket, W. T. Vashugh, and M. F. Wright, secretary of the Oregon Federation of Fraternal societies.

The meeting was the result of a recent sale of a large site on Portland boulevard to a Japanese and a committee appointed to investigate the transaction reported that several other sales of property to Japanese were prevented only by strong opposition on the part of property owners in the neighborhood. Another meeting will be held next Monday night at the same place and Watkins announced that he would speak at length on the immigration question.
