

# HEAVY HENS ARE FIRMER IN PRICE

Heavy hens have been scarce on the Portland market for some time, and as a result, firmer prices will rule Saturday. Light hens are becoming more plentiful, but not in sufficient numbers to glut the market. Prices on dressed chickens will be about the same as a week ago.

Young chinook salmon, of the popular trout size, will probably be scarce after Saturday, as the fishing season closed on them Thursday noon. They are selling for about 35 cents per pound. The most plentiful fish on the market at present is large chinook salmon, silver salmon and halibut. Pork prices are about 1 cent lower than last week, due to a similar drop in prices in the livestock market. Beef and mutton prices are unchanged.

Today the Yamhill street market master continued to quote 30 cents per dozen as the maximum price on eggs. This price is 1 cent below the price which wholesalers are demanding. The consumer should not be surprised, therefore, if Yamhill street egg prices show an advance at almost any moment.

## 17,000 Fruit Trees Will Be Purchased By Wasco Growers

The Dalles, Aug. 25.—W. S. Nelson, head of the agricultural and horticultural bureau of the chamber of commerce, next week will place the largest individual order for fruit trees ever made in the county, with one exception. The trees will come from several nur-

men in western Oregon and Washington, and there will be 17,000 of them. This will be the first of several orders according to the agricultural agent. He was employed last winter to line up additional acreage in the county, and has made remarkable progress. Some of these trees will be used for replacement of old stock, but most of them will go on new lands.

The 17,000 about to be planted represent only the results of the first buying pool. Nelson with others interested in horticultural progress in the county returned only last week from points in western Oregon, where nursery stock was inspected.
