

TRAIN DE LUXE TO CARRY BOOSTERS FOR EXPOSITION

The equipment of the "1925 Special," which will leave the Union depot at midnight, September 18, with a trainload of exposition boosters, to visit cities in Eastern Oregon, will be one of the finest and most complete the O-W. R. & N. ever has sent out. Instructions were issued by William McMurray, general passenger agent, Wednesday to all employees of the railroad company who are interested in any way with the arrangement of the special, to the effect that the train equipment must be the most modern available and in the best possible condition.

"As the party will include some of Portland's most prominent business men, all concerned will make special effort to render such service as will reflect credit upon the Union Pacific system," McMurray said in his letter.

TRAIN OF EIGHT CARS
The train will consist of eight cars including one steel dynamo baggage car, one diner, five 12-section single drawing room standard sleepers and one composite observation car. All will be electric lighted.

The baggage car will be decorated on the sides with water color letters that will inform everyone along the route that the train is the "1925 Special" and that it is out boosting for the Oregon exposition. An electric light design also will be carried on the rear of the observation car conveying the same information.

Three table d'hote meals will be served each day during the trip and the dinners will consist of five courses. In the observation car an attendant will be in charge of soft drinks, cigars, cigarettes, etc., and special attention will be given to watering and icing the train. At all stop-over points the train will be parked in convenient and accessible locations and special attention will be given to the stop at Pendleton as the train will be continuously occupied during the stay there.

TO VISIT ROUND-UP
A day and night will be spent at Pendleton while the excursionists are given an opportunity to take in the Round-Up with its Happy Canyon and other attractions.

Entertainment for the visitors is being arranged at many of the points of call and this will be accepted by the Portlanders, the caravan directors say, but they will not permit pleasure to interfere with the real purpose of the trip, which is to inform the people of Eastern Oregon as to the plans of the exposition committee and to urge them to vote in favor of the measure on the ballot at the November election that will permit Portland to raise the money necessary to finance the exposition.

The caravan will return to Portland at 7:45 a. m. Friday, September 22. The fare for the round trip, including sleeper, meals and the attractions at Pendleton, will be \$51.75. William P. Merry, Title & Trust building, has been placed in charge of the excursion by Mayor Baker and applications for reservations are to be made with him.

Phone Extensions In Forest Sections Are Being Platted

C. M. Allen, telephone engineer for the forest service, has returned from the Rainier, Wenatchee and Snoqualmie national forests of Central Washington, where he has been perfecting the central plating station system of forest protection by means of telephone extensions.

Cooperating with the national park service, the forest service has now established direct telephone communication from Anvil Rock on Mount Rainier to Lewis, where the central station will be located next year. The Greenwater country will also be directly connected.

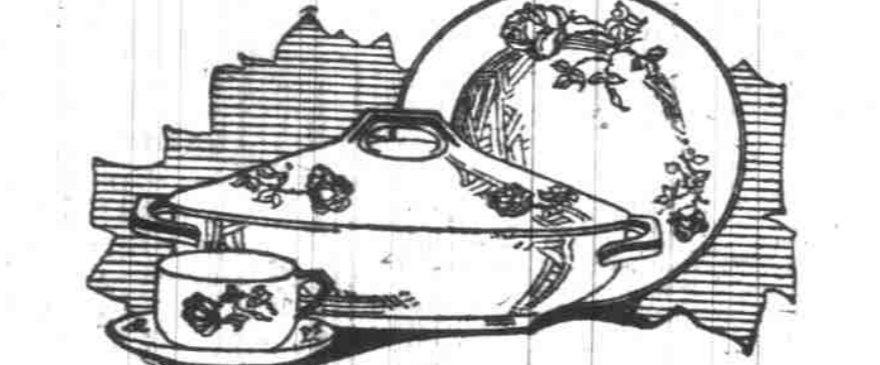

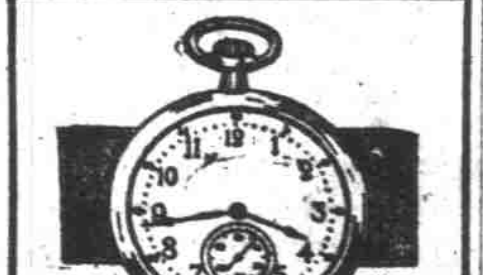
