

CANNING SEASON COMING TO CLOSE

Saturday will end the big canning week of this season. Peaches are plentiful at present, and are selling at 75 and 85 cents per box for the better stuff.

Peaches from The Dalles are showing up better than Yakima fruit, on account of the irrigation of Yakima lands. Non-irrigated peach lands produce much better fruit than do the irrigated farms.

Persons wanting cheaper peaches should buy Willamette valley stuff. Considerable dry rot is in the local fruit after it has been on the market several days, and dealers are endeavoring to get rid of their stocks as soon as possible. The peaches are not badly injured and can be used for canning, since all that is necessary is cutting out the small spots of the rot.

Tomatoes and pears are coming in good at present, and should be taken before very soon if the better quality is wanted.

Wife of Rancher Victim of Bullet Of Husband's Gun

Walla Walla, Wash., Sept. 8.—Mrs. Hermina A. Yennay, 40, wife of Con Yennay, rancher living seven miles north of here, was instantly killed Thursday afternoon by the accidental discharge of a shotgun her husband was carrying, according to a report received by Coroner Joe Chamberlain.

The accident occurred at the Yennay farm home, while the two were walking up Dry creek to make some repairs on an irrigation ditch, the report stated. Yennay took a shotgun along to kill any grouse that he might see, and when he thought he saw one and raised the weapon, Mrs. Yennay said "Don't shoot, it's a hen."

They proceeded on their way and it is thought that Yennay forgot to put the safety catch on his gun and in some manner it went off while he was walking behind his wife, the charge striking her low in the shoulder. She fell in his arms and died almost immediately, according to information reaching here.
