

MASS MEETING WILL BE UNIQUE CHURCH AFFAIR

Orthodox Greek Church and Old Catholic Church to Be Represented at Gathering Monday.

One of the most picturesque and striking gatherings in connection with the General Convention will be the mass meeting Monday night at St. Davids church under the auspices of the commission to confer with the Eastern Orthodox churches and the Old Catholics. This commission under the chairmanship of Rt. Rev. James H. Darlington, bishop of Harrisburg, has been indefatigable in its efforts during the past three years and its activities have extended to Switzerland, Greece, Serbia, Roumania, Czechoslovakia, Constantinople and the Holy Land. Bishop Darlington spent four months abroad visiting the heads of national churches, explaining the Episcopal church to them and inviting representatives to attend the Portland convention.

Representatives are here from the Patriarch of Antioch who lives at Damascus, from the Patriarch of Jerusalem, from the Russian Orthodox church in the United States, and from the Czechoslovakian national church.

APPEAR IN ROBES

They have appeared in their robes at the opening service and have been received by the house of bishops. They will now be formally presented to the people at large at the public meeting Monday.

Bishop Thomas F. Galloway will make a brief opening address and will be followed by Rt. Rev. G. Maffei, who has been great for in the cause of Christian unity.

Each one of the foreign prelates will then be presented and will deliver a brief greeting in his native speech.

Most Rev. Gerasimos Mossara, archbishop of Belutri, will bring a message from the patriarchate of Antioch where the disciples were first called Christians. Most Rev. Panaleimon, archbishop of Neapolis, will speak on behalf of the Patriarch of Jerusalem. His diocese includes Sychar, the site of Jacob's well, where Jesus talked with the woman of Samaria. He will speak in Greek.

SYRIA BY BIBI

Bishop Attimos Olesh is a Syrian by birth but represents the Russian Orthodox church, Patriarch Tikhon of Moscow. He is bishop of Brooklyn.

Bishop Gorazd Pavlik of Olomutz is head of the Czechoslovakian church. He will speak in Czech. He represents both his own and the Serbian people. He was made a bishop by the Serbian church and is highly esteemed by King Alexander of Jugoslavia, who conferred on him the cross of the Order of St. Sava.

The gathering will be unique in that the participants will be gathered in a hall of Harrisburg, which will be an occasion of historical importance. Never before in the United States have Syrians, Greeks, Russians and Czechs been brought into religious affiliation at one time and the occasion will be memorable not only in Portland but for the whole Episcopalian church in the United States.

ACTING SECRETARY

The secretary of the commission, Dr. B. Talbot Rogers, was unable to come to Portland, and the Rev. Thomas J. Lacey, rector of the Redeemer church of Brooklyn, N. Y., is here in his place as acting secretary. Dr. Lacey has been closely identified with the Greek church, has traveled in Greece and knows personally the heads of the church in Athens and Constantinople. As knight commander of the Royal Order of King George I he is in close touch with the Greeks all over the United States and was chosen by the Greek committee last fall to visit President Harding at the White House and present the souvenir from the Greek section of "America's Making Exposition," which occurred last October.
