

# TOMATOES STILL PLENTIFUL HERE

Tomatoes of extraordinary size and quality are still appearing on the market in heavy quantities. Although the vegetables are extremely late in the season, the good quality of them is keeping the demand up. General prices asked for them on the Yamhill public market are 15¢ per box and at 4¢ per pound. Private stores are asking as low as 25¢ per box and as high as 35¢.

Honey is another thing the consumers are still being overcharged for on the market. While it is being sold at 20¢ per comb and two combs for 35¢ in private stores, 15¢ per comb is asked on the Yamhill market.

Vegetables are still in good quantity on the market. Beans are still 5¢ a pound. Cauliflower of excellent quality is 5¢ per head, cabbage 2¢ per pound, and corn at 20¢ per dozen ears.

Although fruit prices are slightly higher than they were a week ago, the quality is not quite so good except in apples and late pears. Peaches, practically worthless, are sold at 15¢ per dozen. The fruit is mostly spotted or dry-rotted. Apples vary in price, due to the different grades. Good eating apples may be obtained at anywhere from 10¢ to 35¢ per dozen. Grapes are still in abundance at reasonable prices. Ladyfingers, the latest arrivals and most dainty, are selling generally at 20¢ per pound, but they may be found cheaper in some places. Tokays are still 15¢ per pound, while malaga are 10¢. Concord are still a dime per pound.

1/4 cup minced ham  
2 tablespoonful butter  
Break macaroni in short lengths and cook until tender (about 30 minutes). Make white sauce of butter, flour, salt and pepper. Alternate layers in greased baking dish of macaroni, ham, white sauce and Tillamook cheese. Cover with buttered crumbs and bake until brown. Caution: If ham is very salty, no additional salt required.
