

Oregon Sunday School Workers Will Hold Convention Here Next Week

ALL COUNTIES TO JOIN IN MEETING

Sunday school workers from all parts of Oregon will assemble in Portland next Wednesday, Thursday and Friday for the 37th annual convention of the Oregon Sunday School association.

Several hundred teachers and officers are expected in the city during the three days. Every county and all the large cities in the state should be represented by delegations.

The convention dates have been arranged so that two internationally known Sunday school men can appear in the program. Wednesday and Thursday J. Shreve Durham of Chicago, superintendent of the home visitation department of the International Sunday School association, will be the principal speaker.

Mr. Pearce has not reached America yet, but should land at Seattle from the Orient on the program here Friday. He has just completed an eight-month tour of the Old World in the service of the International Sunday School work.

Although the delegates pay a registration fee of \$1 for the benefit of the institute work which will feature the convention sessions, the meetings are open to the general public.
